Yak Mat, LLC, Birch Creek Timber, LLC, and Leon Stutzman</u> (Land, Air – Enforcement) – In this enforcement action involving two Greene County sites, the Board granted relief from the hearing requirement of Section 31(c)(1) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/31(c)(1) (2020)) and accepted a stipulation and proposed settlement as to Yak Mat. The Board also ordered Yak Mat to pay a \$21,000 civil penalty and cease and desist from further violations.	5-0 roll call vote

Rolling Meadows Shell Mart, Inc.</u> (Air – Enforcement) – In this enforcement action concerning a Cook County gas station, the Board granted relief from the hearing requirement of Section 31(c)(1) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/31(c)(1) (2020)), accepted a stipulation and proposed settlement, and ordered Rolling Meadows Shell to pay a \$5,000 civil penalty and to cease and desist from further violations.	5-0 roll call vote

Chemtrade Solutions, LLC</u> (Water, NPDES – Enforcement) – Upon receiving a complaint, a stipulation, a proposed settlement, and an agreed motion for relief from the hearing requirement in this enforcement action involving a St. Clair County chemical supply facility, the Board accepted the complaint and directed the Clerk to provide the required newspaper notice of the settlement-related filings.	5-0 roll call vote

Cook-Illinois Corp.</u> (Water, NPDES – Enforcement) – Upon receiving a complaint, a stipulation, a proposed settlement, and an agreed motion for relief from the hearing requirement in this enforcement action involving a Lake County school bus transportation and maintenance facility, the Board accepted the complaint and directed the Clerk to provide the required newspaper notice of the settlement-related filings.	5-0 roll call vote
<a href="#"><u>PCB 22-86</u></a>	<u>People of the State of Illinois v. 6702 Pulaski, LLC, d/b/a BP</u> (Air – Enforcement) – The Board accepted for hearing the People’s complaint concerning 6702 Pulaski’s gas station in Cook County.	5-0 roll call vote
<a href="#"><u>PCB 22-87</u></a>	<u>4 Nelson Farms, Inc. v. Illinois Environmental Protection Agency</u> (Water – Tax Certification) – The Board found and certified that 4 Nelson Farms’ livestock waste management facilities in Henry County are pollution control facilities for preferential tax treatment under the Property Tax Code (35 ILCS 200/11-10 (2020)).	5-0 roll call vote
