OPINION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD (by M.D. Mankowski):

On April 11, 2024, the County of LaSalle (County) timely filed an administrative citation against Brian Basil. *See* 415 ILCS 5/31.1(c) (2022); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.300(b), 108.200(b)(3). The administrative citation concerns Basil's property located at 4007 South Illinois Route 251 in Mendota, LaSalle County. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Agency) as the "Basil Property" site and is designated with Site Code No. 0990555045. For the reasons below, the Board finds that Brian Basil violated the Environmental Protection Act (Act) and orders him to pay \$4,500 in civil penalties.

Under the Act, an administrative citation is an expedited enforcement action brought before the Board seeking civil penalties that are fixed by statute. Administrative citations may be filed only by the Agency or, if the Agency has delegated the authority, by a unit of local government, and only for limited types of alleged violations. *See* 415 ILCS 5/21(o), 21(p), 22.51, 22.51a, 31.1(c), 42(b)(4), 42(b)(4-5), 55(k) (2022); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 108.

In this case, the County alleges that on February 20, 2024, Basil violated Sections 21(p)(1), 21(p)(3), and 21(p)(7) of the Act (415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1), (p)(3), (p)(7) (2022)) by causing or allowing open dumping in a manner resulting in litter, open burning, and deposition of general construction or demolition debris or clean construction or demolition debris. The County asks the Board to impose the statutory \$1,500 civil penalty per violation on Basil, for a total civil penalty of \$4,500. As required, the County served Basil with the administrative citation on April 2, 2024, which is within "60 days after the date of the observed violation." 415 ILCS 5/31.1(b) (2022); see also 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.300(c), 108.200(b)(1).

To contest an administrative citation, a respondent must file a petition with the Board no later than 35 days after being served with the administrative citation. If the respondent fails to do so, the Board must find that the respondent committed the violations alleged and impose the corresponding civil penalty. See 415 ILCS 31.1(d)(1) (2022); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.300(b), 108.204(b), 108.406. Here, any petition for review was due by Tuesday, May 7, 2024. Basil failed to timely file a petition. Accordingly, the Board finds that Brian Basil violated Sections 21(p)(1), 21(p)(3), and 21(p)(7) of the Act.

The civil penalty for violating any provision of Section 21(p) is \$1,500 for each violation, except that the penalty amount is \$3,000 for each violation that is the person's second or subsequent adjudicated violation of that provision. See 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2022); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 108.500(a). Because there are three violations of Section 21(p) and there is no indication in the record that any of these is a second or subsequent adjudicated violation, the total civil penalty is \$4,500. Under Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, the Board attaches the administrative citation and makes it part of the order below.

This opinion constitutes the Board's finding of fact and conclusions of law.

ORDER

- 1. The Board finds that Brian Basil violated Sections 21(p)(1), 21(p)(3), and 21(p)(7) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1), (p)(3), (p)(7) (2022)).
- 2. Brian Basil must pay a civil penalty of \$4,500 no later than Monday, June 17, 2024, which is the first business day following the 30th day after the date of this order. Brian Basil must pay the civil penalty by two separate certified checks or money orders, each in the amount of \$2,250, the first made payable to the LaSalle County Treasurer and the second made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund. The case number and case name must appear on the certified checks or money orders.
- 3. Brian Basil must send the first certified check or money order to:

4. Penalties unpaid within the time prescribed will accrue interest under Section 42(g) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/42(g) (2022)) at the rate set forth in Section 1003(a) of the Illinois Income Tax Act (35 ILCS 5/1003(a) (2022)).

5. Payment of this penalty does not prevent future prosecution if the violations continue.

IT IS SO ORDERED.

Section 41(a) of the Environmental Protection Act provides that final Board orders may be appealed directly to the Illinois Appellate Court within 35 days after the Board serves the order. 415 ILCS 5/41(a) (2022); see also 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.300(d)(2), 101.906, 102.706. Illinois Supreme Court Rule 335 establishes filing requirements that apply when the Illinois Appellate Court, by statute, directly reviews administrative orders. 172 Ill. 2d R. 335. The Board's procedural rules provide that motions for the Board to reconsider or modify its final orders may be filed with the Board within 35 days after the order is received. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.520; see also 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.902, 102.700, 102.702. Filing a motion asking that the Board reconsider this final order is not a prerequisite to appealing the order. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.902.
