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Letter from the Chairman

The Board had a very active rulemaking docket in October. Rulemaking activity is summarized below. As always, information about these proceedings is available through the Clerk's Office Online (COOL) at our Web site at www.ipcb.state.il.us.

On October 21, 2010, the Board adopted for second-notice <u>Revision of Mailing</u> <u>Address for Service of Documents: Proposed Amendment to 35 Ill. Adm. Code</u> <u>101.304</u> (R10-22). Originally proposed by the Office of the Illinois Attorney General, this rulemaking corrects and updates mailing addresses listed in the Board's procedural rules.

On October 7, 2010, the Board adopted for second notice <u>10-Year Federally</u> <u>Enforceable State Operating Permits (FESOP): Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code</u> <u>201.162</u> (R10-21). The proposal extends the maximum term from five years to ten years for a Federally Enforceable State Operating Permit (FESOP) issued by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA).



October 7, 2010, the Board adopted regulations in <u>RCRA Subtitle C (Hazardous Waste) Update, USEPA</u> <u>Amendments (January 1, 2009 through June 30, 2009)</u> (R10-4) and <u>RCRA Subtitle C (Hazardous Waste) Update,</u> <u>USEPA Amendments (July 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008)</u> (R09-16) (consolidated). This consolidated rulemaking is an identical-in-substance rulemaking and the amendments will not be filed for 30 days to allow the United States Environmental Protection Agency to submit additional comments.

On October 7, 2010, the Board adopted a first-notice opinion and order in <u>Ameren Ashpond Closure Rules</u> (<u>Hutsonville Power Station</u>)Proposed: 35 Ill. Adm. Code 840.101 through 840.152 (R09-21). This site-specific regulation proposal would allow Ameren to close a surface impoundment containing coal combustion waste at the electricity-generating Hutsonville Power Station in Crawford County.

On October 21, 2010, the Board adopted <u>In the Matter of: Proposed Amendments to the Board's Special Waste</u> <u>Regulations Concerning Used Oil, 35 Ill. Adm. Code 739, 808, 809</u> (R06-20(B)). Subdocket B includes definitions of terms in newly adopted regulations relating to the management of used oil in Illinois. In an order dated February 18, 2010, the Board adopted amendments to the used oil management and special waste regulations in Subdocket A.

On October 19 and 20, 2010, the Board held a public hearing in <u>Water Quality Standards and Effluent Limitations</u> for the Chicago Area Waterway System and the Lower Des Plaines River: Proposed Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. <u>Code 301, 302, 303 and 304</u> (R08-9(A) and (B)). The Subdocket A hearing was held to receive comments on the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity decision not to conduct an economic impact study in that subdocket. The Subdocket B hearings were held to hear testimony concerning an epidemiological study of recreational users on the Chicago Area Waterways. The epidemiological study, known as the Chicago Health Environmental Exposure and Recreation Study (CHEERS), was commissioned by the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago. On October 22, 2010, the hearing officer entered an order closing the comment period on November 30, 2010, for Subdocket A. In a second order, the hearing officer scheduled a prehearing conference on October 28, 2010, to discuss upcoming hearings in November for Subdockets C and D.

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Rulemaking Update

Board Updates Illinois Hazardous Waste rules in <u>RCRA Subtitle C (Hazardous Waste) Update, USEPA</u> <u>Amendments (July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009, and June 15, 2010)</u>, R09-16/R10-4(Oct.21, 2010)

On October 21, 2010, the Board adopted amendments to the hazardous waste regulations "identical-in-substance" to those adopted by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) during the time periods of July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009, and June 15, 2010. This proceeding adopts amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 703, 720, 721, 722, 724, and 725, as required by Section 7.2 of the Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/7.2 (2008). These USEPA rules implement Subtitle C of the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 (RCRA Subtitle C). The Board will cause the filing of the adopted amendments with the Office of the Secretary of State to be published in the *Illinois Register* after holding the docket open for 30 days to receive any comments on the adopted rules by USEPA. The Board presently intends to complete all work on these amendments and file them on or before November 15, 2010.

The USEPA rules included in this docket are listed chronologically below:

October 30, 2008 (73 Fed. Reg. 64668)	Adoption of Definition of Solid Waste Rule (DSWR) amendments: (1) exclusion of "hazardous secondary materials" (HSMs) that are the subject of "legitimate reclamation" from the definition of solid waste; (2) addition of a procedure for an administrative "non-waste" determination for HSMs that are used like a product or intermediate in a continuous industrial process; and (3) addition of financial assurance requirements applicable to
	entities other than the generator that manage HSMs.
December 1, 2008 (73 Fed. Reg. 64668)	Adoption of optional alternative hazardous waste generator requirements applicable to "eligible academic entities" (college and university laboratories and other facilities affiliated with colleges and universities). The alternative standards will apply in lieu of the pertinent of the generally applicable large-quantity waste generator, small- quantity waste generator, or conditionally exempt small-quantity generator waste regulations.
December 19, 2008 (73 Fed. Reg. 77954)	Addition of "emission-comparable fuel" (ECF) to the existing "comparable fuels" exclusion from the definition of solid waste, including ancillary amendments to accommodate the addition of ECF.
June 25, 2009 (74 Fed. Reg. 30228)	USEPA amended references to reflect the change in name of the "Office of Solid Waste" to its new name, "Office of Resource Conservation and Recovery."

June 15, 2010 (75 Fed. Reg. 33712)	USEPA withdrew the ECF rule from the December	
	19, 2008 amendments (described above) to the

Board Adopts First Notice Proposal in <u>In the Matter of: Ameren Ash Pond Closure Rules (Hutsonville Power</u> <u>Station): Proposed 35 Ill. Adm. Code Part 840.101 Through 840.144</u>, R09-21(Oct .7, 2010)

The Pollution Control Board, on October 7, 2010, adopted a first-notice proposal in the site-specific rulemaking docketed as <u>In the Matter of: Ameren Ash Pond Closure Rules (Hutsonville Power Station): Proposed 35 Ill. Adm.</u> <u>Code Part 840.101 Through 840.144,</u>(R09-21. Ameren Energy Generating Company (Ameren) filed the original site-specific rulemaking proposal on May 19, 2009. Ameren sought adoption of standards under which it could close Ash Pond D, a surface impoundment managing coal combustion waste at Ameren's Hutsonville Power Station located near Hutsonville in Crawford County. After the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) responded to that proposal by offering various revisions, Ameren and the IEPA, on September 22, 2009, submitted a joint rulemaking proposal. The Board held a public hearing on the joint proposal on October 29, 2010.

The Board adopted the joint proposal without significant substantive amendments for first notice publication in the *Illinois Register*. The Board's first-notice proposal includes requirements for a final cover system for Ash Pond D, a groundwater monitoring system and program, a groundwater collection trench to address off-site impacts and various procedures for IEPA oversight of the closure process.

Publication of the proposal in the *Illinois Register* commences a 45-day written public comment period. The Board does not presently intend to hold an additional hearing.

The Board Adopts Second Notice Proposal to Amend Its Air Rules in <u>In the Matter of: 10-Year Federally</u> <u>Enforceable State Operating Permits (FESOP): Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 201.162,</u> R10-21 (Oct. 7, 2010).

The Pollution Control Board, on October 7, 2010, adopted a second notice proposal for review by the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR) extending the maximum term that the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) could issue a Federal Enforceable State Operating Permit (FESOP) from five years to ten. JCAR has scheduled the rule for review at its November 16, 2010 meeting.

On April 20, 2010, the IEPA filed the proposal which is docketed as <u>In the Matter of: 10-Year Federally</u> <u>Enforceable State Operating Permits (FESOP): Amendments to 35 III. Adm. Code 201.162</u>, R10-21. The sole provision of the air rules to be amended is Section 201.162. To expedite this rulemaking, in a June 17, 2010 opinion and order, the Board authorized the first notice publication of the rules as proposed without commenting on the merits of the IEPA proposal. First notice of the proposed rules appeared in the July 2, 2010 *Illinois Register. See* III. Reg. 8508(July 2, 2010). The Board held hearings on the proposal on July 8 and 21, 2010. No written public comments were received.

The Board adopted the proposal for second notice review without change from that adopted at first notice. During hearing, the IEPA presented testimony that extending the maximum term that IEPA could issue a FESOP from five to ten years would result in an expected reduction of administrative resources and costs to both the affected sources

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with a five percent decrease in workload of FESOP renewals within five years of adoption of the proposal. The Board found that IEPA's granting FESOPs for a longer term will not affect the implementation of air pollution control programs or enforcement of air quality standards in the State of Illinois and is compliant with all applicable federal standards.

On October 21, 2010, the Board adopted a second notice proposal for review by the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules to amend the Board's procedural rules. Restricted Status/Critical Review

The Environmental Protection Act prohibits the Agency from issuing a construction permit that will cause or extend a violation. A construction permit to expand the distribution system cannot be granted when a water supply has a maximum contaminant level or treatment technique violation, an inadequate source of raw water supply, inadequate treatment plant capacity, finished water storage or distribution system pressure. A Restricted Status List is published quarterly in the Illinois Pollution Control Board Environmental Register to notify those persons considering expansion of a water supply distribution system of that status before large sums of money have been spent on items such as land acquisition, financing and engineering fees. A companion Critical Review List is published concurrently with the Restricted Status List and has the water supplies that are approaching a point where the supply could be placed on Restricted Status. A permit application from a supply on Critical Review will be examined carefully to ensure that the proposed construction will not cause a violation. Restricted Status and Critical Review are presented as a combined list with the status of the water supply denoted as either RS (Restricted Status) or CR (Critical Review). The current list reflects the status as of October 1, 2010. An asterisk, *, beside the water supply indicates public water supplies that have been added to the Restricted Status/Critical Review list since the previous publication.

Restricted Status List

The Restricted Status List was developed to give additional notification to officials of public water supplies which are in violation of 35 III. Adm. Code, Subtitle F: Public Water Supplies, Chapter I or the Illinois Environmental Protection Act.

The Restricted Status List will include all Public Water Supplies for which the Agency has information indicating a violation of any of the following requirements: Finished water quality requirements of 35 III. Adm. Code, Part 604, Subparts B and C; maintenance of adequate pressure on all parts of the distribution system under all conditions of demand; meeting raw water quantity requirements of 35 III. Adm. Code 604.502; or maintenance of treatment facilities capable of providing water "assuredly adequate in quantity" as required by Section 18 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act.

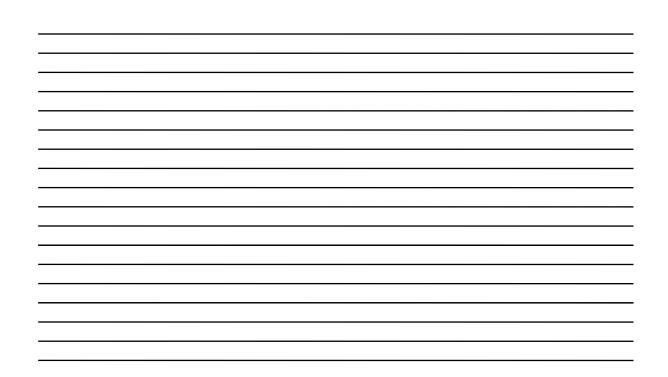
A public water supply on the Restricted Status List will not be issued permits for water main extensions, except for certain limited situations, or unless the supply has been granted a variance from the Illinois Pollution Control Board for the violation, or from permit issuance requirements of Section 39 of the Act.

This list is continually being revised as new information becomes available, and therefore, specific inquiries as to the status of any public water supply should be directed to the Division of Public Water Supplies for final determination.

Critical Review List

The Critical Review List was developed to give additional notification to officials of public water supplies which may be close to being in violation of 35 III. Adm. Code, Subtitle F: Public Water Supplies, Chapter I or the Illinois Environmental Protection Act. A supply will be placed on the Critical Review List when Agency records indicate that it is approaching any of the violations that would place it on the Restricted Status List. This list is continually being revised as new information becomes available, and therefore, specific inquiries as to the status of any public water supply should be directed to the Division of Public Water Supplies for final determination. -----CUT HERE-----
