Dear Ms. Livingston:

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency ("Illinois EPA") has reviewed Horsehead Corporation's ("Horsehead's") April 16, 2015 request for a provisional variance pursuant to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 722.134(b). Based on this review, a provisional variance for a period of 30-days is GRANTED by the Illinois EPA.

The applicable facts of this request are as follows:

- 1. Horsehead is a zinc recycling facility located at 2701 East 114th Street, Chicago, Illinois. Presently Horsehead has approximately 3,300 pounds of waste PPE (personal protective equipment), belts, and hoses contaminated with listed hazardous wastes D006 (Cadmium) and D008 (Lead). The waste is in two covered roll-off boxes stored near the baghouses at the facility.
- 2. Horsehead ships its hazardous waste to a Giant Resource Recovery (GRR) facility in Sumter, South Carolina. GRR then ships the hazardous waste to its facility in Harleyville, South Carolina. GRR recently advised Horsehead of an April 13, 2015 fire at the Harleyville facility that has idled operations until an investigation is completed concerning the cause of the fire.
- 3. The 90-day holding period for the 3,300 pounds of hazardous waste ends on April 28, 2015.
- 4. Horsehead states that the 3,300 pounds of hazardous waste is and will be properly stored and managed at its facility, that it is seeking this provisional variance so as not to violate the applicable hazardous waste storage requirements, and that no similar extension for this hazardous waste has been previously requested.

35 III. Adm. Code 722.134(b) allows a generator to seek an extension of up to 30 days, by means of a variance or provisional variance, from the Illinois EPA if hazardous waste must remain onsite for longer than 90 days due to unforeseen, temporary, and uncontrollable circumstances. The Illinois EPA finds that such facts and circumstances exist in this situation and hereby GRANTS Horsehead a provisional variance pursuant to 35 III. Adm. Code 722.134(b) for a period of 30 days.

Horsehead shall sign a certificate of acceptance of this provisional variance and return it to James G. Richardson #21 at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276 on or before April 27, 2015. The certification should take the following form:
