One of the things that I'm quite concerned about is ground water contamination from the ash ponds. As I understand, last year the IEPA issued a notice of violation about ground water contamination; is that correct? MR. DUNAWAY: That's correct. MR. OWER: Is there anything in this permit that would require amending the standards or monitoring or regulation or plans to clean up that ground water contamination? MR. DUNAWAY: The permit, itself, does not contain any ground water monitoring; however, as a result of that violation notice, there was an approved compliance commitment agreement which does require ongoing monitoring, also requires installation of a couple of additional wells at the site. Now is that a continuous monitoring MR. OWER: or how often? MR. DUNAWAY: Quarterly. MR. OWER: Could that be increased, I mean quarterly? Can we check that more often, and what kind of plan is there?

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MR. DUNAWAY:

Currently, we don't believe the

active ash ponds are the source of contamination. There appears to be some other source, other than the active ash ponds.

We do not necessarily know what that is right now, but we have had discussions with Midwest Generation, and they are looking at the situation, and they have engaged their consultants in looking into that also.

MR. OWER: The other thing is I understand the U.S. EPA is currently revising their rules as far as coal ash pollution, the pollutant runoff from the ash ponds. Is that correct?

Have they asked the Illinois EPA to try to look at changing their standards?

MR. LeCRONE: I can take that one. U.S. EPA has proposed to update the effluent limitation guidelines for the steam electric subcategory which uses the power stations.

Some of that will include potentially new limitation upon ash discharge and that sort of thing. It's still in the rule-making process, so there hasn't been any final decision what that final rule is going to look like at this point.
