MOTION FOR RELIEF FROM HEARING REQUIREMENT

NOW COMES Complainant, People of the State of Illinois, by KWAME RAOUL, Attorney General of the State of Illinois, and requests relief from the requirement of a hearing in this matter. In support thereof, Complainant states as follows:

1. On May 27, 2020, Complainant filed a Stipulation and Proposal for Settlement executed between Complainant and Respondent, Erickson Steel Company, Inc.
2. Section 31(c)(2) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31(c)(2) (2018), provides as follows:
 - (c)(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subdivision (1) of this subsection (c), whenever a complaint has been filed on behalf of the Agency or by the People of the State of Illinois, the parties may file with the Board a stipulation and proposal for settlement accompanied by a request for relief from the requirement of a hearing pursuant to subdivision (1). Unless the Board, in its discretion, concludes that a hearing will be held, the Board shall cause notice of the stipulation, proposal and request for relief to be published and sent in the same manner as is required for hearing pursuant to subdivision (1) of this subsection. The notice shall include a statement that any person may file a written demand for hearing within 21 days after receiving the notice. If any person files a timely written demand for hearing, the Board shall deny the request for relief from a hearing and shall hold a hearing in accordance with the provision of subdivision (1).
3. No hearing is scheduled in this matter.

4. Complainant hereby requests relief from the requirement of a hearing pursuant to Section 31(c)(2) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31(c)(2) (2018).
