1 HEARING OFFICER FOX: Good morning and welcome
2 to this Illinois Pollution Control Board hearing.
3 My name is Tim Fox, and Mark Kaminski and I are the
4 assigned hearing officers for this rulemaking
5 entitled, Amendments to 35 Illinois Administrative
6 Code, Subtitle C, Water Pollution. The Board
7 Docket Number for this rulemaking is R18-23.

8 First, introductions, present today here
9 in Chicago from the Board are Members Cynthia
10 Santos at my right and Jennifer Van Wie at my left,
11 the two assigned Board members to this rulemaking.
12 I saw in Chicago that our fiscal officer Bruce
13 Bennett was there. He's not visible in camera, but
14 I believe he was planning on staying for the
15 hearing.

16 Secondly, some background on this docket.
17 January 10, 2018, the Illinois Environmental
18 Protection Agency filed a rulemaking proposal under
19 the governor's Executive Order Number 16-13. That
20 order directed state agencies to review regulations
21 to identify those that are either outdated,
22 repetitive, confusing, unnecessary or harmful to
23 the state's economy, and the order directed
24 agencies to amend or repeal those regulations as

1 necessary.

2 IEPA's proposal included numerous changes
3 to these Subtitle C regulations. At the same time
4 the Board had begun its own review of its rules,
5 and on March 22, 2018, the Board opened this docket
6 specifically to address its Subtitle C.

7 On November 4 of 2021, the Board adopted a
8 proposal for public comment which requested comment
9 both generally and on 41 specific matters. IEPA
10 filed detailed responses on December 30 of 2021.

11 The Board held its first hearing on the
12 proposal on January 6 of 2022, and originally
13 schedule A second hearing on February 3 of this
14 year, but it was necessary to cancel and reschedule
15 that hearing because of unusually severe winter
16 weather and a disaster proclamation by the
17 governor.

18 So today is of course our rescheduled
19 second hearing. The Board published notice on
20 February 4, 2022, in both the Chicago Sun Times and
21 the Springfield Journal Register.

22 A hearing officer ordered directed
23 participants intending to testify at this hearing
24 to prefile their testimony by Thursday, March 10 of

1 2022, but the Board did not receive any prefiled
2 testimony for this video hearing. Any document to
3 be offered as a hearing exhibit must have been
4 received by the Board's clerk at least 24 hours
5 before our scheduled start date. The Board of
6 course did not receive any exhibits either.
7 However, the rules specifically allow a participant
8 to file a document that's not allowed as a hearing
9 exhibit as a public comment at a later date.

10 Some quick housekeeping, this hearing is
11 governed by the Board's procedural rules. All
12 information that is relevant and that is not
13 repetitious or privileged will be admitted into the
14 record. Please bear in mind that any questions
15 that may be posed today by the Board members or
16 staff are intended solely to help develop a clear
17 and complete record for the Board's decisions and
18 do not reflect any decision on the proposal, the
19 testimony or any comments.

20 For the sake of our court reporter, please
21 speak clearly and avoid speaking at the same time
22 as another person so that we can have as clear a
23 transcript as possible.

24 Finally, our proposed order today, we can

1 begin with any persons who indicate that they would
2 like to offer a public comment on the Board's
3 November 4 proposal. There's a sign-in sheet at or
4 near the entrance to each of the two Board hearing
5 rooms. Please note that public comments can also
6 be submitted electronically through the clerk's
7 office online or COOL.

8 Next we would ordinarily turn to prefiled
9 testimony. As I of course mentioned, we did not
10 receive any. We then can see whether there is
11 anyone who did not prefile testimony, but would
12 like to testify here today as the Board's rules
13 allow.

14 Fourth, we'll then address the Board's
15 request that the Department of Commerce and
16 Economic Opportunity, or DCEO, conduct an economic
17 impact study. And then before we adjourn we can
18 again quickly determine whether there is anyone
19 else who would like to offer a public comment.

20 Any questions about that proposed order of
21 proceeding today?

22 MS. DIERS: Here in Springfield, none.

23 HEARING OFFICER FOX: Miss Diers, thank you.

24 Since we, as I mentioned of course, did

1 not receive prefiled testimony, let me quickly
2 determine whether there's anyone there in
3 Springfield or here in Chicago that did not prefile
4 testimony, but would like to testify today.

5 Neither seeing, nor hearing any indication
6 that there is, we can move on to the issue of the
7 economic impact study.

8 Section 27(b) of the Environmental
9 Protection Act provides that the Board must request
10 the DCEO conduct an economic study of proposed
11 rules before the Board adopts them. The Board then
12 must make either the study or DCEO's explanation
13 for not conducting one available to the public at
14 least 20 days before a public hearing.

15 In a letter dated October 26 of 2021, the
16 Board's chair Barbara Flynn Currie requested the
17 DCEO conduct an economic impact study of this
18 proposal. The Board specifically requested a
19 response no later than December 10 of 2021.

20 On November 17 of last year, the Board
21 received a response from the acting director of
22 DCEO which respectfully declined the request to
23 perform an economic impact study.

24 Is there anyone who would like to testify

1 regarding either the Board's request or DCEO's
2 response?

3 Neither seeing, nor hearing any in
4 Springfield or in Chicago, let me quickly determine
5 whether there is anyone who would like to offer a
6 public comment on the Board's proposal. In Chicago
7 I can see that our sign-in sheet does not include a
8 name.

9 Miss Diers, if I may ask you, is there
10 anyone who appears to wish to offer a comment
11 there?

12 MS. DIERS: There's no one in Springfield.

13 HEARING OFFICER FOX: I am not surprised by
14 that answer. Thanks for your help on that detail.

15 I think we're ready to adjourn pretty
16 fairly quickly. The court reporter indicates that
17 our transcript of this lengthy hearing should be
18 available no later than Thursday, March 24. What
19 I'd propose is the standard 14-day comment deadline
20 with posthearing comments due on Thursday, April 7.

21 Is there anyone there in Springfield that
22 would have any objection to that proposed date or
23 propose another date?

24 MS. DIERS: April 2 is fine with the agency.

1 HEARING OFFICER FOX: I'm sorry. I may not
2 have been clear, Miss Diers, April 7.

3 MS. DIERS: I'm sorry. Okay. We're fine on
4 April 7, right? Yes, we can do April 7.

5 HEARING OFFICER FOX: Excellent. That's again
6 allowing one week to receive the transcript and
7 then two weeks for the posthearing comments, and
8 I'm fairly certain that works out to be Thursday,
9 April 7.

10 MS. DIERS: Perfect. Thank you.

11 HEARING OFFICER FOX: I'm glad you said 2nd,
12 Miss Diers. That let me give you effectively five
13 extra days.

14 MS. DIERS: Thank you. I love it.

15 HEARING OFFICER FOX: No worries at all.

16 Then hearing no other proposed date or no
17 objection, the posthearing comments will be due on
18 Thursday, April 7. Please note that filing such as
19 these posthearing comments must also be served on
20 the hearing officer and on participants that are on
21 the Board's service list. Before filing, please
22 check with COOL or with the Board's clerk by
23 telephone to ensure that you have the most recent
24 version of the Board's service list.

1 Miss Diers or Miss Brown, are there any
2 other issues or matters that need to be addressed
3 before we adjourn?

4 MS. BROWN: Not on behalf of EIRG, no.

5 MS. DIERS: Not on behalf of the agency.

6 HEARING OFFICER FOX: Miss Brown, I should've
7 asked you, if you don't mind, just to identify
8 yourself for the record.

9 (Reporter clarification.)

10 HEARING OFFICER FOX: Miss Brown, I'm sorry for
11 the interruption, for the record if you just could
12 identify yourself for the record.

13 MS. BROWN: Absolutely. Melissa Brown,
14 M-e-l-i-s-s-a, last name Brown, B-r-o-w-n, outside
15 counsel for the Illinois Environmental Regulatory
16 Group also known as EIRG, I-E-R-G.

17 HEARING OFFICER FOX: Miss Brown, thank you.

18 And, Miss Diers, if I may ask you and the
19 representatives of the EPA to do the same thing,
20 please.

21 MS. DIERS: Absolutely. It's Stefanie Diers,
22 it's S-t-e-f-a-n-i-e, Diers is D-i-e-r-s, counsel
23 for Illinois EPA. And then I'll let our folks
24 introduce themselves and spell their names for the

1 court reporter.

2 MR. TWAIT: Scott Twait, T-w-a-i-t, Illinois
3 EPA Water Quality Standards Section.

4 MR. KONDELIS: Nick Kondelis, K-o-n-d-e-l-i-s,
5 attorney with Illinois EPA.

6 MR. FLEMING: Brant Fleming, B-r-a-n-t,
7 F-l-e-m-i-n-g, Division of Water Pollution Control
8 Permits.

9 MR. LISKA: Mark Liska, M-a-r-k, L-i-s-k-a,
10 Bureau of Water and Division of Water Pollution
11 Control.

12 MS. DIERS: We have one more.

13 MS. YETUNDE: Agbesola Yetunde spelled
14 Y-e-t-u-n-d-e, the last is A-g-b-e-s-o-l-a, Water
15 Quality Standards Environmental Protection Agency
16 Specialist.

17 HEARING OFFICER FOX: Thank you. Miss Diers,
18 that's the full range of your staff for this
19 hearing; is that correct?

20 MS. DIERS: Yes, it is. Thank you.

21 HEARING OFFICER FOX: Excellent. And I think I
22 asked once before, it's worth repeating. Are
23 interest any other details we would need to wrap up
24 or things to address before we adjourn?

1 MS. DIERS: Not here in Springfield.

2 HEARING OFFICER FOX: Not here in Chicago
3 either, so we can adjourn. Thank you all for your
4 participation. We'll look forward to any final
5 posthearing comments and determine whether to
6 proceed to first notice very shortly after that.
7 Thank you all.
