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Pollution Variance

Ameren Energy Generating Company, Amerenenergy Resources Generating Company, and Electric Energy, Inc. (collectively, "Ameren") with sources located in Montgomery County, Fulton County, Peoria County, Massac County, Crawford County, Morgan County and Jasper County, have filed with the Illinois Pollution Control Board (Board) a petition for variance under Title IX of the Environmental Protection Act (Act) [415 ILCS 5/Sec. 35-38]. The Board has the authority pursuant to Section 35 of the Act [415 ILCS 5/35] and 35 Ill. Adm. Code 104 to grant a variance. Ameren requests a variance from a provision of the Illinois Multi-Pollutant Standard ("MPS"), 35 Ill. Adm. Code 225.233, for a period beginning January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2014. Specifically, Ameren seeks a variance from only one of the components of the MPS, Section 225.233(e)(2)(A) which establishes an emissions rate for sulfur dioxide. A copy of this variance may be obtained through the Clerk's Office at the Board. The Board's office address is Pollution Control Board, James R. Thompson Center, 100 West Randolph Street, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601 (telephone: 312/814-3620).

The Illinois EPA solicits the views of persons who may be affected by the variance. Address any comments or inquires to: John J. Kim, Managing Attorney, Air Regulatory Unit, Division of Legal Counsel, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, Post Office Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276, telephone: 217/782-5544.

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Illinois EPA) is preparing a recommendation, and, unless otherwise ordered by the hearing officer or Board, plans to file the recommendation by November 14, 2008. The record will remain open for 45 days after the filing of the recommendation and is available at the Board office for inspection, except those portions that are protected from disclosure under 35 Ill. Adm. Code 130. Procedures are available whereby disclosure may be sought by the public.

A hearing may be held after the filing of the recommendation. However, if a written objection to the variance and a request for hearing are received by the Board office, no later than twenty-one (21) days from the publication of this Notice, the Board must conduct a hearing on the petition.



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
