- MR. McCAMBRIDGE: On the record. It's
- now 1:17. This is the public hearing in the
- 3 R 10-7 rulemaking entitled definition of the
- OM update, USEPA regulations, January 1st,
- ⁵ 2009, through June 30th, 2009.
- 6 Included in this identical and
- ⁷ substance rulemaking is a federal adoption of
- 8 two new exemptions from the definition of the
- 9 OM. The USEPA adopted them on January 21st
- of 2009, which would give these a due date of
- January 21st, 2010. The two compounds that
- are included in this are propylene carbonate,
- which has the IUPAC name
- 4-methyl-1,3-Dioxolan-2-one, and the second
- compound is dimethyl carbonate.
- USEPA has determined that these
- compounds participate negligibly in the
- formation of tropospheric ozone, so that they
- are no longer going to be counted for VOM
- emissions purposes.
- The secondary thing that this
- accomplishes is by exclusion of these two
- solvents and re-agents from the definition of
- 24 the OM USEPA is encouraging their use in a

- way so that they can be used in place of
- other chemicals that may have more
- deleterious effects environmentally.
- 4 My name is Mike McCambridge. I'm
- 5 the hearing officer. With me is the entire
- 6 board. We have Board member Johnson, Board
- member Blankenship, Chairman Girard, Board
- member Zaleuski, and Board member Moore.
- ⁹ This is probably the most heavily attended
- identical and substance hearing we've ever
- ¹¹ had.
- MR. JOHNSON: In history.
- MR. McCAMBRIDGE: In history. At this
- point I would like to ask Dr. Girard if he
- has anything or if any other Board member has
- anything to say?
- MR. GIRARD: Well, thank you. I would
- just like to welcome representatives of the
- 19 Illinois EPA at this hearing.
- MR. JOHNSON: Singular.
- MR. GIRARD: Singular, and thank
- everyone else for attending and turn it back
- 23 to Mike.
- MS. ZALEUSKI: And Charles. Carry it to

- 1 Charles.
- MR. McCAMBRIDGE: Charles, have you met
- our new Board member, Carrie Zaleuski?
- MR. MATOESIAN: No, I haven't. Nice to
- 5 meet you.
- MS. ZALEUSKI: Nice to meet you.
- 7 MR. MATOESIAN: Thank you.
- MR. McCAMBRIDGE: And this is a rather
- 9 unusual aspect of this hearing. In order to
- conserve State resources Mr. Matoesian is
- monitoring this hearing from Springfield
- remotely. That saves the State the cost of
- his time and the cost of transporting him
- here for this. If Mr. Matoesian has anything
- to add to the record, he will do so by
- written comment after this hearing.
- Now, the Board got the proposal in
- this on October 1st, 2009. A notice of
- 19 proposed amendments appeared in the
- October 16th issue of the Illinois Register.
- The public comment period is 45 days, which
- would expire, I believe, on November 30th.
- In the October 1st order we had
- projected a later publication date stating
