This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Perry County Solld Waste Management Department, a delegated county of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2006).

FACTS

- That Respondent, Perry Ridge Landfill, is the permitted owner and operator of a facility located at 6305 Sacred Heart Road, DuQuoin, Perry County, Illinois.
- That Mike Whitlock is the Certified Operator of the above-referenced facility.
- 3. That said facility is operated as a sanitary landfill, operating under Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Permit No. 2000-064-LF, and is designated with LPC No. 1450105039. The facility is commonly known to the Perry County Solid Waste Management Department as Perry Ridge Landfill.
- 4. That Respondents have owned and/or operated said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
- 5. That on January 14, 2010, Rebecca Tracy of the Perry County Solld Waste Management

 Department inspected the above-referenced facility. A copy of her inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

That on February 11, 2010, Rebecca Tracy sent this Notice of Filing of the Administrative
 Citation via Untied States Postal Service certified mail Nos: 70090080000170850579 and
 70090080000170850562.

VIOLATION\$

Based upon direct observations made by Rebecca Tracy during the course of her January 14, 2010 inspection of the above-referenced facility, the Perry County Solid Waste Management Department has determined that Respondents violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- (1) That Respondents conducted a sanitary landfill operation in a manner which resulted in uncovered refuse remaining from a previous operating day, a violations of Section 21(o)(5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(o)(5) (2006); and,
- (2) That Respondents conducted a sanitary landfill operation in a manner which resulted in failure to collect and contain litter at the end of the operating day, a violation of Section 21(o)(12) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(o)(12) (2006).

CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4) (2006), Respondents are subject a civil penalty of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). If Respondents elect not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than June 1, 2010, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution

Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2006), and If the Illinois

Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violations(s) as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing,

Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Macon County Solid Waste

Management Department and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the statutory civil penalty of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2006), if Respondent falls to petition or elect not to petition the Iflinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and a finding of violation(s) as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's check shall be made payable to the Perry County Solid Waste Management Department and mailed to the attention of Rebecca Tracy, Perry County Solid Waste Management Department, 3764 State Route 13/127, Pinckneyville, Illinois 62274. Along with payment, Respondent shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not pald within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received.

The Office of the Perry County State's Attorney may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondent in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondent has the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2006). If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondent shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Perry County State's Attorney, 1 Public Square, Pinckneyville, Illinois

62274. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondent.

GENERAL REMARKS

During the above date and time, an inspection of the Perry Ridge Landfill was conducted. Weather conditions were approximately 35 degrees with a slight wind. The inspection was conducted by Becky Tracy, Perry County Solid Waste.

I arrived at the scale house at 2:54 p.m. and checked in.

I went to the office for the records inspection. Mike Whitlock, General Manager was present for the records inspection. There had been no special waste since the last inspection of 12/31/2009. The 01/12/2010 Monthly Site Inspection report indicated that they were working on the area near the tipper and recovering it with dirt. The Alternate Daily Cover records Indicated that tarps were used on 01/09 thru 01/13; that some construction/demolition debris was used on 01/06 thru 01/08; tarps were used on 01/04 thru 01/05; and, some construction/demolition debris was used on 01/02. The leachate system records indicated some problems with the pipes freezing on 01/8, 9, 11, 12 and indicated that work was being done on those days to work to unfreeze the pipes. The records indicated that 1,809 million gallons of leachate was hauled in 2009. The leachate, leachate transport, load check, alternate daily cover and daily operations records were reviewed and appeared in order and up to date.

As I arrived at the leachate tanks, I observed a Big Dawg roll off truck and a trash dump truck leaving the facility. I arrived at the leachate tanks at 3:22 p.m. The level indicator was at approximately 21 feet (Photo 001).

I proceeded to the leachate pump box. The pump was set to "auto" and the green light indicating that the pump was engaged was on. The level was 14.9 inches and decreasing. At about 12 inches the pump kicked off and the level began to rise again.

I arrived at the active area at 3:33 p.m.

Photo 002 depicts the new cell. Per Mike Whitlock, the liner has been installed since Oct/Nov and they are awaiting sand. I have noted very little progress on the new cell in the past couple of months. When the sand application has been completed they will have to conduct new testing on the liner because of the weather conditions since the liner was installed.

Photo 003 depicts the tipper area. The area contains scattered litter and construction/ demolition debris that does not meet the standards of the permit. The scattered litter is not from the current operating day and has been in this location repeatedly. Photo 004 depicts the slope north of the tipper area. Photo 005 depicts the active area. A dozer and compactor were working the area to move and compact the refuse. They appeared to be operating in the prescribed manner.

As I observed operations, I noted that a dozer was moving around at the top of the north slope moving soil for daily cover. At 3:41 p.m. a Panther city Hauling trash truck arrived to dispose of refuse. At 3:48 p.m. another unidentified trash truck arrived to dispose of refuse. The dozer and compactor worked to move and compact the newly deposited refuse.

I continued to observe the operations, and at 4:02 p.m. employees unloaded several boxes of new tarps. These tarps were taken to the top slope via a dozer. At 4:09 p.m. four (4) employees began unrolling tarps for alternate daily cover. The dozer was still working at the top of the slope moving soil for daily cover. At 4:24 p.m. Mike Whitlock arrived and took another dozer to the top to help with soil cover. They were working to cover the area around the tipper with soil. Photo 006 depicts the area east of the tipper being covered with soil.

Photo 007 depicts tarps being applied to the active area. Photo 008 depicts a portion of the active area partially covered with tarps, the very bottom portion and the very top portion have refuse which is not yet covered; however, the dozer was still working at the top of the slope to cover uncovered refuse. Photo 009 depicts the area around the tipper and the dozer working to cover the area with soil.

I left the site at 4:54 p.m.


