Building collapses in Roodhouse

"And the walls came tumbling down" - a memorable line from a famous John Cougar Mellencamp song - became a reality as the building on the corner of Worcestor and Clay streets on the Roodhouse Square collapsed Tuesday, May 28.

"I was in the doctor's office waiting on my appointment when I heard this rumbling," Bill Weddersten said. "I looked out the window and all I could see was this big cloud of smoke across the street."

The building was recently purchased by newly-appointed alderman Ray Newingham, who was notified of the collapse and arrived on the scene 30 minutes later.

Roodhouse Mayor Joe Snyder said he received a call that a building had collapsed around 9 a.m. and immediately went to the scene.

"When I arrived, there were quite a few people standing around, including several
