

JURISDICTION

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Macon County Environmental Management Department, a delegated county of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act , 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2008).

FACTS

1. That Respondent, Kevin E. Woodruff, is the land owner of a property located at 3878 W. Center St., Decatur, Macon County, Illinois.
2. That Respondent has owned and/or operated said property at all times pertinent hereto.
3. That on July 28, 2014, Laurie Rasmus of the Macon County Environmental Management Department inspected the above-referenced facility. A copy of her

inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

4. That on August 14, 2014, I sent this Notice of Filing of the Administrative Citation via United States Postal Service certified mail # 7007 0220 0001 1331 3756.

VIOLATIONS

Based upon direct observations made by Laurie Rasmus during the course of her July 28, 2014 inspection of the above-referenced facility, the Macon County Environmental Management Department has determined that Respondent violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- (1) That Respondent caused or allowed open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in litter, a violation of Section 21(p)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1) (2008); and
- (2) That Respondent caused or allowed open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in open burning, a violation of Section 21(p)(3) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(3) (2008); and
- (3) That Respondent caused or allowed open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in deposition of General Construction or Demolition Debris as defined in Section 3.160(a), a violation of Section 21(p)(7) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(7) (2008).

CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4) (2008), Respondents are subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$4,500.00). If

Along with payments, Respondent shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Forms to ensure proper documentation of payments.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Macon County State's Attorney may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondent in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS
ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondent has the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2008). If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondent shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Macon County State's Attorney at 253 East Wood Street, Decatur, Illinois 62523. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondent.

Respondent elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than November 03, 2014, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2008), and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation(s) as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Macon County Environmental Management Department and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the statutory civil penalty of Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$4,500.00).

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2008), if Respondent fails to petition or elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and a finding of violation(s) as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's checks shall be made payable in equal amounts (50% of total penalty each) to:

(1) Macon County Environmental Management Department and mailed to the attention of Debra Hughes-Garrett, Macon County Environmental Management Department, 141 South Main Street, Room 408, Decatur, Illinois 62523.

(2) Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276.


Affiant, Laurie Rasmus, being first duly sworn, voluntarily deposes and states as follows:

1. Affiant is a field inspector employed by the Macon County Environmental Management Department and has been so employed at all times pertinent hereto.



Inspection Report Narrative

The above referenced site was inspected on July 28, 2014 between 2:35 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. The inspection was conducted by Laurie Rasmus, representing the Macon County Environmental Management Department. Weather conditions at the time of the inspection were partly cloudy skies, approximately 70 degrees Fahrenheit with north-northwest winds of approximately ten miles per hour. Seven photographs were taken. No samples were collected. Other than the Harristown Fire Protection District (HFPD) personnel, no persons were observed on site during the inspection.

General Information/Site History

The property is addressed as 3878 West Center Street, Decatur and is located in the Decatur Township of Macon County. According to the Macon County Recorder's Office, the property is owned by Kevin Woodruff, who was granted the property in May 2014.

This initial inspection was conducted after receiving notification from a Macon County employee at 2:01 p.m. on the day of the inspection that a building on the property had recently been demolished on its foundation and the debris on the foundation was currently burning.

Inspection Findings

Upon arrival, I parked in the grassy area east of where I saw smoke rising. I then walked to the west where I saw that the HFPD was present with no less than two vehicles and three persons. I photographed the site from vantage points where smoke and water were not being directed. I then met with Captain K.R. Owens of the HFPD.

Two areas were observed to be burning. The following was observed regarding the southern of the two burning areas (photos 01-03, 06 - 07):

- HFPD personnel were applying water onto the area which was cloaked in smoke and steam.
- The burning area appeared to be covered with demolition debris including bricks, charred bricks, charred and partially melted roofing shingles, fragments of roofing shingles, charred wood waste, charred dimensional lumber, charred woody landscape waste and ash.

- Southeast of the burning area was an accumulation of vinyl siding and an accumulation of concrete pieces (photo 06).
- West of the burning area a piece of heavy equipment was parked (photo 07).

The following was observed regarding the northern of the two burning areas (photos 04 – 05):

- Woody materials including tree waste and pallets were piled together in an area approximately fifty feet north-south by twenty feet east-west.
- Flames were present at the south end of the pile and smoke was rising from the center area of the pile.

During my conversation with Captain Owens, he reported:

- A lieutenant from the department had briefly talked to an unidentified man who was briefly seen on site.
- The Warrensburg Fire Protection District (WFPD) had been called in to assist.
- It was his intent to fully extinguish the fire.

Following my observations and conversation with Captain Owens, I concluded the inspection and drove from the vicinity.

Post-Inspection Communication

After returning to my office on the day of the inspection at 3:40 p.m., I received a telephone call from Captain Keith Hackl of WFPD. Captain Hackl reported the following:

- A man, who was described as the owner of the property, had stated that he himself had lit the pile in the back of the property but not the front.
- The fire in the pile in the back would also be extinguished since it appeared to contain waste items such as pallets.

Summary of Apparent Violations

Environmental Protection Act 415 ILCS 5/1 et seq. (formerly Ill Rev. Stat. Ch. 111 ½, 1001 et seq.) {hereinafter referred to as the "Act"}

Pursuant to Section 9(a) of the Act, no person shall cause, threaten, or allow; or tend to cause, threaten or allow, air pollution in Illinois.

- A violation of Section 9(a) is alleged because evidence of open-burning that would cause, threaten, or allow; or tend to cause, threaten, or allow air pollution in the State of Illinois was observed during the inspection.

Pursuant to Section 9(c) of the Act, no person shall cause or allow the open burning of any refuse, conduct any salvage operation by open burning or cause or allow the burning of any refuse in any chamber not specifically designed for the purpose and not approved by the agency.

- A violation of Section 9(c) is alleged because evidence that open burning of refuse occurred on site was observed during the inspection.

Pursuant to Section 21(a) of the Act, no person shall cause or allow the open dumping of any waste.

- A violation of Section 21(a) is alleged because evidence of open dumping of waste was observed during the inspection.

Pursuant to Section 21(d)(2) of the Act, no person shall conduct any waste-storage, waste-treatment, or waste-disposal operation in violation of any regulations or standards adopted by the Board under this Act.

- A violation of Section 21(d)(2) is alleged because waste was disposed of and/or stored in a way that violates regulations and standards adopted by the Board.

Pursuant to Section 21(e) of the Act, no person shall dispose, treat, store or abandon any waste, or transport any waste into this State for disposal, treatment, storage or abandonment, except at a site or facility which meets the requirements of this Act and of regulations and standards there under.

- A violation of Section 21(e) is alleged because waste was disposed of and/or stored in a manner that does not meet the requirements of the Act.

Pursuant to Section 21(p)(1) of the Act, no person shall cause or allow the open dumping of any waste in a manner which results in any of the following occurrences at the dump site...litter.

- A violation of Section 21(p)(1) is alleged because evidence that open dumping of waste was caused or allowed to occur and resulted in litter deposition on site was observed during the inspection.

Pursuant to Section 21(p)(3) of the Act, no person shall cause or allow the open dumping of any waste in a manner which results in any of the following occurrences at the dump site...open burning.

- A violation of Section 21(p)(3) is alleged because evidence that open dumping of waste was caused or allowed to occur and resulted in open burning on site was observed during the inspection.

Pursuant to Section 21(p)(7) of the Act, no person shall cause or allow the open dumping of any waste in a manner which results in any of the following occurrences at the dump site...clean construction and/or demolition debris as defined in Section 3.160(b) of this Act.

- A violation of Section 21(p)(7) is alleged because the open dumping of waste was caused or allowed to occur and resulted in the deposition of clean construction and/or demolition debris on site.
