#### JURISDICTION

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2014).

#### **FACTS**

- 1. That Henry J. Herbert d/b/a Joe's Auto Salvage & Towing is the current owner and operator ("Respondent") of a facility located at 10585 Highway 149 West, West Frankfort, Franklin County, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency as Joe's Auto Salvage & Towing.
  - That said facility is designated with Site Code No. 0550705047.
  - That Respondent has owned and operated said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
- 4. That on September 18, 2014, Garrison Gross of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's ("Illinois EPA") Marion Regional Office inspected the above-described facility. A copy of his inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

5. That on 10-9-14, Illinois EPA sent this Administrative Citation via Certified Mail No. 7012 0470 0001 3000 9842

#### **VIOLATIONS**

Based upon direct observations made by Garrison Gross during the course of his September 18, 2014 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondent has violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

(1) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in litter, a violation of Section 21(p)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1) (2014).

#### CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2014), Respondent is subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00)</u>. If Respondent elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than <u>December 1, 2014</u>, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2014), and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each

violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2014), if Respondent fails to petition or elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondents shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondent in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

# PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondent has the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2014). If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondent shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondent.



Subject: Follow-Up Inspection at Joe's Auto Salvage & Towing

General Remarks: A follow-up inspection was conducted on Thursday, September 18, 2014, at Joe's Auto Salvage & Towing. The inspection was conducted by Garrison Gross representing the Illinois EPA Bureau of Land. The site is located at 10585 Highway 149 West, West Frankfort, Illinois 62896. The towing service impound yard is located a short distance east of the salvage yard at 10673 Highway 149 West. The impound yard is north of the Herbert residence. The inspection was conducted as a follow-up to the October 29, 2013 ACWN and to determine compliance status. Weather conditions at the time of the inspection were clear skies, 75° F, with a moderate breeze. Surface conditions at the site were dry. The inspection began at 1:35 P.M and ended at 2:40 P.M.

<u>Inspection Findings</u>: I entered the business and met with Scott Herbert. Carolynn Herbert arrived during the later part of the inspection. The facility is licensed with the Secretary of State as an auto parts recycler, rebuilder and used car dealer. A towing service is operated off of an adjacent property. Scott Herbert accompanied me during the inspection.

Mercury Switches: Mr. Herbert informed me that the facility had been collecting mercury switches from waste / end-of-life vehicles. He reported that the ELVS bucket was sent in at the end of December 2013. No switches had been removed since that time. Vehicles had been removed from the site in 2014. Mr. Herbert stated that mercury switches had been removed prior to delivery to T.A. Pollack in West Frankfort. The facility did not have a replacement bucket and Mr. Herbert said he had requested a new one online. I told him to contact ELVS by telephone to request a new bucket. He was not able to locate a copy of the annual report at the time of the inspection.

**Tire Storage:** All tires had been stored inside the utility building (photo 002). Approximately 150 used / waste tires were observed. Most of the tires were still on the rim. Mr. Herbert stated that tires are derimmed and the wheels are separated to be sold as an automotive part or for scrap. No tire disposal receipts were available. He stated that the tire hauler won't pick up less than 100 tires. During the previous inspection, Liberty Tire had disposed of 153 tires on April 4, 2013. I recommended that the facility de-rim the tires and dispose of them using a registered tire transporter or dispose of waste tires in scrap vehicles sent to their scrap processor.

Tire Sales: The facility had not been selling tires.

Universal Wastes Batteries: No universal waste batteries were observed at the site. Mr. Herbert said he had made a sign for the storage area but had been exchanging them as a core return when a new battery was purchased. He intended to establish a storage area in the utility building near the used oil storage area.

Automotive Fluids: Automotive parts (engines and transmissions) are periodically removed from processed vehicles. Mr. Herbert told us that vehicles are processed inside the shop building. Gas tanks, engines and transmissions are stored in an open utility shed and inside the utility building. Automotive fluids are stored in 55-gallon drums which are stored in both the shop and the utility building. Used coolant and gasoline are reused in facility vehicles. Used oil is collected and reportedly burned in an oil burning furnace. The furnace is located in the shop. A used oil storage tank is located in the shop and used oil drums are stored in the shop and the utility building. The drums and tank were labeled (photo 001).

Waste / End-Of-Life Vehicles (Salvage Yard): Approximately 70 vehicles were stored at the salvage yard. Approximately 30 vehicles located along the north and east boundaries of the salvage yard were considered waste due to age, condition and overgrowth in vegetation (photos 003, 004, 006-009, 011, 012, and 014). Most of the vehicles at the site appeared to be more than ten years old and did not appear to be operable. Most of them did not appear to have been stripped of essential parts and appeared to be intact other than damage incurred in traffic accidents. Some of them had their wheels removed. Most of the waste vehicles were not staged in an organized manner and were haphazardly arranged. It appears that the vehicles are being speculatively accumulated. All but three of the waste vehicles were intact (photos 011, 012 and 013). One waste vehicle was missing the floor pan and woody vegetation (appeared to be sumac) was growing up through the vehicle (photo 013). Several vehicles in the overgrown areas had license plates with registrations dating back to 2008 and 2009. Mr. Herbert was questioned about the vehicle crusher (photo 015). He said they hadn't crushed for approximately 5 years and the crusher wasn't operational. He said it had an issue with the fuel system. Scrap vehicles were being hauled to T. A. Pollack Company in West Frankfort. The facility police book showed that 12 vehicles were removed from the site in 2013 and 6 vehicles were removed in 2014. Most of them were 1990's model vehicles. The police book showed that 86 vehicles were present when Secretary of State Auditors conducted their inspection on November 11, 2013.

Waste / End-Of-Life Vehicles (Impound Yard): Approximately 50 vehicles were stored at the impound yard. At least eight vehicles at the impound yard were observed during the previous inspection and had not been processed in a reasonable timeframe (within 90 days of receipt) (photos 016-018). A few vehicles were overgrown in vegetation (photo 019). Vehicles were not being removed from the impound yard on a routine basis. Mr. Herbert stated that one vintage vehicle was being stored at the site for a friend. Mr. Herbert said the City of West Frankfort and the State Police were not providing the necessary documents to allow them to obtain junk titles. Some of the vehicles at the impound yard appeared to be more than 10 years old.

Waste Metal / Open Dumping: Waste pallets had been removed from the site. Scrap metal (shelving, racks, expanded metal grating and other scrap metal) was dumped in three locations (photos 003, 005 and 010). These items were overgrown in vegetation and were observed in the same location and in a similar condition during the last inspection. Mr. Herbert said he intended to use the shelves and racks.

**NPDES Permit:** Mrs. Carolynn Herbert told me that Shawnee Surveying and Consulting had submitted the Notice of Intent but the Agency had not issued the NPDES Permit at this time.

Closing Conference: They were informed that vegetation needed to be controlled at the site. I told them that vehicles located along the facility boundaries appeared to be waste / end-of-life and needed to be removed. I also told them that vehicles in the impound yard were not being processed in a reasonable timeframe. I informed them that the facility would be receiving a letter in the near future.

Additional Remarks: The facility registered as a Tire Storage Site in 2013 but is meeting the requirements for the storage-exemption. Agency records indicate that the facility has filed for an NPDES Stormwater Permit. Illinois Department of Revenue records indicate that Joe's Auto Salvage & Towing is a sole proprietorship owned by H. Joe Herbert.









Exposure #: 001 Comments: drums of used automotive fluids



building


