

<u>JURISDICTION</u>

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2014).

FACTS

- 1. That Joseph DeRosa & Gwen A. Griffitts are the current property owners and DeRosa Autobody is the current operator (collectively "Respondents") of a facility located at 2235 E. Ash Street, Springfield, Sangamon County, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency as Springfield/DeRosa Autobody.
 - That said facility is designated with Site Code No. 1671209146.
 - 3. That Respondents have owned/operated said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
- 4. That on December 2, 2014 Charlie King of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's ("Illinois EPA") Springfield Regional Office inspected the above-described facility. A copy of the inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

5. That on 12-31-14, Illinois EPA sent this Administrative Citation via Certified Joseph De Rosa.

VIOLATIONS

Based upon direct observations made by Charlie King during the course of the December 2, 2014 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondents have violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- (1) That Respondents caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in litter, a violation of Section 21(p)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1) (2014).
- (2) That Respondents caused or allowed water to accumulate in used or waste tires, a violation of Section 55(k)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 55(k)(1) (2014).

CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2014), Respondents are subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00)</u>. If Respondents elect not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than <u>February 13, 2015</u>, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondents elect to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2014), and if the Illinois

Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondents shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2014), if Respondents fail to petition or elect not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondents shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondents from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondents in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondents have the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2014). If Respondents elect to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondents shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondents.

NARRATIVE INSPECTION REPORT DOCUMENT

The purpose of this memorandum is to serve as the Narrative Inspection Report Document of an inspection conducted at the subject site on December 2, 2014, from approximately 9:28 a.m. until 10:01 a.m., by this author. John Blazis, BOA/FOS – Springfield Region accompanied me as part of this multi-media inspection. Mr. Blazis' Complaint/Incident Record accompanies this report. No one accompanied me on the inspection. The inspection was conducted because of a complaint received at the Illinois EPA – Springfield Regional Office.

The complainant alleged that overspray paint from DeRosa's Autobody drifts onto adjacent properties. The complainant also alleged that used oil and used antifreeze are dumped on the ground and Freon is vented to the atmosphere. Because of the nature of the complaint, Mr. Blazis participated to investigate the paint overspray and Freon venting. This inspector participated to investigate ground contamination of any type, including used oil and antifreeze spills and open dumping.

The inspection revealed evidence of open dumping and water in used tires, both violations of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (Act). The site was first inspected on December 20, 2005 by Richard Johnson, then of BOL/DLPC/FOS – Springfield Region. Mr. Johnson's inspection resulted in the finding of violations of Sections 9(a), 9(c) and 55(a)(3) of the Act. As a result, a Non-Compliance Advisory Letter was sent to the business dated January 18, 2006. On April 6, 2006, Mr. Johnson re-inspected the property. That re-inspection resolved the Section 9 violations. However, the 55(a)(3) violation was again cited, as was a violation of 35 I.A.C., Section 739.122(c)(1). The respondent finally responded in an undated letter received at the the Illinois EPA Springfield Regional Office on May 23, 2006. This response was adequate, and the respondent and business was informed of this finding in a letter dated June 6, 2006. However, that letter also pointed out that due to past violations, a future inspection would be conducted. That re-inspection was conducted on December 15, 2006. The facility was found to be in compliance and the owner and business were informed of this in a letter dated January 9, 2007.

On March 15, 2010, DeRosa Autobody was re-inspected after a new complaint. Multiple violations of the Act and a violation of the regulations, 35 I.A.C. were once again alleged. A Violation Notice, L-2010-01098, was issued on April 8, 2010, this time to the business and two respondent owners. The respondents cleaned the site up again, and submitted documentation of the clean-up attached to an undated letter received at the Illinois EPA – Springfield Regional Office on May 17, 2010. As a result, a return to compliance letter was issued June 11, 2010.

No further inspections were conducted until the December 2, 2014 inspection on yet another complaint as previously discussed in this letter. As noted, open dumping was again observed and is alleged.

The site is located at 2235 E. Ash Street, Springfield, IL 62703 (an aerial photo of the location is already in the Division File), and is operated by DeRosa's Autobody. The owners of the property where the site is located are Joseph DeRosa & Gwen A. Griffitts, 3980 Irwin Bridge Road, Cantrall, IL 62625. Their telephone number is: 217-487-7196 (H) and 217/741-0221 (cell). Current property tax information is attached.

Upon arrival at the site on the day of the inspection, the weather was cloudy and cool, with an air temperature of approximately 27° F. Winds were northwesterly at approximately five (5) mph. Surface soil conditions were frozen.

Upon arrival at the site on the day of the inspection, 12 vehicles were observed parked on-site. Some of the vehicles had license plates and some did not. Some appeared to have some body damage, but most did not. The business hours were posted on the front of the business, which was supposed to be open. The building that houses the business appears to be an old garage with a double garage door on the left and a single door on the right, when facing the business. Heat was observed emitting from a chimney near the rear of the building. However, no one answered the door when I knocked on it multiple times. I therefore left a business card at the business.

Open dumped wastes were observed in front of the business, on both sides of the business, and in the rear of the business. The description of the Digital Photographs provides details of the wastes observed. However, other than three one-gallon containers of marked solvent, each about three-quarters full, the wastes appeared to be non-hazardous. Open dump wastes included metals, plastics, paint filters, sand paper, paint masks, ashes, ten used tires, wood, paper, bottles, cans, carpet, burnt copper wire, cardboard and some electronics, such as two television sets. Most of the used tires were off-rim, and most of those contained water. Vehicle parts were also observed on the ground, but would not be considered wastes if they are still useable.

Upon arrival at the site on the day of the inspection, 21 photographs were taken with a Digital Camera. From the inspection and the photographs, a computer generated sketch of the site was developed by this author. It shows the layout of the site, as well as the numbers, approximate locations and directions of the photographs. The digital camera provides a three-digit number to each photograph, i.e., 001, 002, etc. This is how the photographs are referenced in this narrative and on the Digital Photograph pages. Real numbers were used on the Site Sketch, i.e., 1, 2, etc. Copies of the Digital Photographs and the Site Sketch accompany this narrative.

The Digital Photographs are described as follows:

Photo # 001 shows an overview of the property from behind the house, looking towards the business. Some of the vehicles shown had license plates, while others did not.

Photo # 002 shows the name of one of the owners on the east door of the garage shown in photo # 001.

Photo # 003 shows the name on the sign on the left front of the garage. The sign reads, "Derosa's Auto Body, Open, Monday – Friday, 9 am -5 p.m." We arrived on-site at 9:28 a.m. We knocked on the door shown in photo # 002 several times. Heat was emitting from the chimney, but no one answered the door.

Photo # 004 shows wastes in a pile on the ground at the front of the garage at the west side of the property. It measured approximately 20' x 10' x 3' and consisted of used tires with water in them, plastics, car parts, cardboard, cloth, tarps and carpet.

Photo # 005 shows water in a used tire.

Photo # 006 shows water and ice in another used tire.

Photo # 007 shows a television, a Cadillac car part, a vehicle fender, cardboard, the inside of a car door, a tarp, plastics and metals.

Photo # 008 shows three one-gallon cans of Pro Clear, a solvent stored outdoors. Paint is on all three cans. Each can was approximately ¾'s full, but the actual contents are unknown. The paint on the cans might reflect paint related waste solvent, but the actual contents are unknown at this point. Hazardous and Non-Hazardous Waste Determinations must be made on the contents of each can, if the cans contain waste. Such determinations are not required for useable product.

Photo # 009 shows paint filters, sand paper a painter's mask, plastic and wiring in one of three plastic barrels. The others contained plastics, paper and food can wastes.

Photo # 010 shows a television set on the ground, just outside of the door to the facility.

Photo # 011 shows the west side of the garage building with wastes in an area of approximately 15' x 5' x 2'. Wastes included a used tire on-rim, the television shown in photo # 010, a shovel, plastics, metals, car parts, black garbage bags with unknown contents and wood.

Photo # 012 shows an oil filter, plastics, a bucket with cans and bottles, a spilled bucket with paper and plastic refuse, and wood. Along the west side of the garage building.

Photo # 013 shows an old burn barrel on concrete blocks near the back of the building. Cardboard is in the left foreground of the photo.

Photo # 014 shows the inside of the burn barrel shown in photo # 013 contained ashes.

Photo # 015 shows IEPA/BOA Inspector John Blazis observing wastes on the ground behind the business. Primarily bottles, cans and ashes littered the backyard.

Photo # 016 shows ashes and other burnt wastes dumped on the ground, apparently after being burned in the burn barrel shown at the far left, and in photo #s 13, 14 and 15. The other burnt wastes included paper, cardboard, bottles and cans.

Photo # 017 shows a close-up of burned copper wire dumped with the other ashes on the ground.

Photo # 018 shows a used tire, plastics, a paint tree, cloth, metals and wood on the east side of the front of the garage.

Photo# 019 shows paint sweepings or overspray on the ground in front of the right garage door.

Photo # 020 shows wastes on the east side of the facility, including paper, plastics an empty white drum, wood and clothing wastes, and the paint tree shown in photo # 018.

Photo # 021 shows apparent paint overspray or paint sweepings on the ground in front of the left garage door. Wastes measured approximately 2' \times 8' \times 4'.

During the inspection, apparent violations of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (Act) and of the regulations, Title 35, Illinois Administrative Code, Subtitle G (35 I. A. C.) were observed. Those apparent violations of the Act are Sections 9(a), 9(c), 21(a), 21(d)(2), 21(e), 21(p)(1), 55(a)(1) and 55(k)(1). Apparent violations of the regulations are: Sections 722.111 and 808.121. Additional information is provided in the Open Dump Inspection Checklist, attached.


OTHER COMMENTS
