### OPINION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD (by C.K. Zalewski):

For the reasons below, the Board accepts the proposed settlement and dismissal of this administrative citation enforcement action. The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Agency) timely filed an administrative citation on May 16, 2014, against Charles H. Scheafer, Jr. d/b/a Chuck's Auto Sales (respondent). The Agency alleged that on April 9, 2014, respondent violated Sections 21(p)(1), (p)(3) and 55(k)(1) of the Environmental Protection Act (Act) by causing or allowing the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in litter and open burning, as well as causing or allowing water to accumulate in used or waste tires. 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1), (p)(3), 55(k)(1) (2012). The violation allegedly took place at respondent's facility located at 3920 North Boulevard Avenue, Peoria Heights, Peoria County (the Site). The property is commonly known to the Agency as the "Chuck's Auto Sales" site and is designated with Site Code No. 1434755034.

Respondent timely filed a petition to contest the administrative citation, which the Board accepted on July 10, 2014. On January 20, 2015, the parties filed a "stipulation of settlement and dismissal of respondent's petition for administrative review" (Stip.). Under its terms, respondent admits that he violated Section 21(p)(1) of the Act by open dumping resulting in litter at the Site and agrees to pay the statutory civil penalty of \$1,500 for this violation. Stip. at 2, citing 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1) (2012). Respondent also agrees to the dismissal of his petition contesting the administrative citation. Stip. at 3. The stipulation further states that violations observed during the April 9, 2014 inspection are not continuing at this time. *Id.* at 2. Finally, the Agency agrees not to refer the violations that are the subject of the administrative citation to the Office of the Illinois Attorney General or any other prosecuting authority to initiate a civil enforcement action. *Id.* at 3.

The Board accepts the stipulation and proposal for settlement. Under Section 31.1(d) of the Act, the Board therefore finds that respondent violated Section 21(p)(1) of the Act. 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1), 31.1(d) (2012). Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act establishes a civil penalty of \$1,500 for this violation. 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2012). The Board accordingly assesses a civil

penalty of \$1,500. To effectuate the parties' intent that respondent pays a total civil penalty of \$1,500, the Board dismisses the alleged violations of Section 21(p)(3) and 55(k)(1) of the Act.

This opinion constitutes the Board's findings of fact and conclusions of law.

#### **ORDER**

- 1. The Board accepts and incorporates by reference the stipulation and proposed settlement.
- 2. The Board finds that Charles H. Scheafer, Jr. d/b/a Chuck's Auto Sales (respondent) violated Section 21(p)(1) of the Environmental Protection Act (Act). 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1) (2012).
- 3. Respondent must pay a civil penalty of \$1,500 no later than March 9, 2015, which is the first business day following the 30th day after the date of this order. Respondent must pay the civil penalty by certified check or money order, made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund. The case number, case name, and respondent's social security number or federal employer identification number must be included on the certified check or money order.
- 4. Respondent must send the certified check or money order to:

- 5. Penalties unpaid within the time prescribed will accrue interest under Section 42(g) of the Act at the rate set forth in Section 1003(a) of the Illinois Income Tax Act. 415 ILCS 5/42(g) (2012); 35 ILCS 5/1003(a) (2012).
- 6. The Board dismisses the alleged violations of Section 21(p)(3) and 55(k)(1) of the Act and respondent's petition to contest the administrative citation. 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(3), 55(k)(1) (2012).

#### IT IS SO ORDERED.

Section 41(a) of the Act provides that final Board orders may be appealed directly to the Illinois Appellate Court within 35 days after the Board serves the order. 415 ILCS 5/41(a) (2012); *see also* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.300(d)(2), 101.906, 102.706. Illinois Supreme Court Rule 335 establishes filing requirements that apply when the Illinois Appellate Court, by statute, directly reviews administrative orders. 172 Ill. 2d R. 335. The Board's procedural rules provide that motions for the Board to reconsider or modify its final orders may be filed with the Board within 35 days after the order is received. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.520; *see also* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.902, 102.700, 102.702.

#### JURISDICTION

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2012).

#### **FACTS**

- 1. That Charles H. Schafer, Jr. d/b/a Chucks Auto Sales, is the current owner and operator ("Respondent") of a facility located at 3920 N. Boulevard Avenue, Peoria Heights, Peoria County, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency as Chucks Auto Sales.
  - That said facility is designated with Site Code No1434755034.
  - 3. That Respondent has owned and operated said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
- 4. That on April 9, 2014, Gerald McGhee of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's ("Illinois EPA") Peoria Regional Office inspected the above-described facility. A copy of his inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

5. That on 5-13-14, Illinois EPA sent this Administrative Citation via Certified Mail No. 7012 0470 0001 3000 8418.

#### **VIOLATIONS**

Based upon direct observations made by Gerald McGhee during the course of his March 29, 2014 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondent has violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- (1) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in litter, a violation of Section 21(p)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1) (2012).
- (2) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in open burning, a violation of Section 21(p)(3) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(3) (2012).
- (3) That Respondent caused or allowed water to accumulate in used or waste tires, a violation of Section 55(k)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 55(k)(1) (2012).

#### CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2012), Respondent is subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>Four Thousand Five Hundred (\$4,500.00)</u>. If Respondent elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than <u>June 23, 2014</u>, unless otherwise provided by order of the

Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2012), and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2012), if Respondent fails to petition or elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondent shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondent in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

# PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondent has the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2012). If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondent shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondent.
