ORDER OF THE BOARD (by J.A. Burke):

On May 6, 2013, United States Steel Corporation (U.S. Steel) timely filed a petition asking the Board to review an April 1, 2013 determination of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Agency). The Agency’s determination concerns U.S. Steel’s integrated iron and steel mill located at 20th and State Streets, Granite City, Madison County. On June 6, 2013, the Board granted U.S. Steel’s motion to stay the effectiveness of the contested permit conditions.

On February 10, 2015, U.S. Steel filed a motion to stay this proceeding. U.S. Steel requests the stay to allow time for the revision and reissuance of a separate permit “in order to reach resolution in this matter.” Motion at 2. U.S. Steel’s motion included information detailing why the stay is needed, a waiver of the decision deadline, and a status report, as required by 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.514(a). The Agency did not file a response to the motion, although U.S. Steel states that “Counsel for Respondent has no objection to the granting of this Motion.” Motion at 4.

The Board finds that U.S. Steel has established a stay is appropriate. U.S. Steel does not specify a deadline for the stay; however, the current decision deadline in this case is April 30, 2016. The Board therefore grants U.S. Steel’s motion and stays this proceeding until January 1, 2016. Any motion to stay this appeal beyond that date must be directed to the Board and accompanied by a status report by January 1, 2016.
