OPINION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD (by C.K. Zalewski):

On November 19, 2018, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Agency) timely filed an administrative citation against Dean Kibler. *See* 415 ILCS 5/31.1(c) (2016); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.300(b), 108.200(b)(3). The administrative citation concerns Dean Kibler’s property located at 101 N. Monroe Street in St. Joseph, Champaign County. The property is commonly known to the Agency as the “St. Joseph/Kibler, Dean” site and is designated with Site Code No. 0190905027. For the reasons below, the Board finds that Dean Kibler violated the Environmental Protection Act (Act) (415 ILCS 5 (2016)) and orders him to pay \$6,000 in civil penalties.

Under the Act, an administrative citation is an expedited enforcement action brought before the Board seeking civil penalties that are fixed by statute. Administrative citations may be filed only by the Agency or, if the Agency has delegated the authority, by a unit of local government, and only for limited types of alleged violations. *See* 415 ILCS 5/21(o), 21(p), 22.51, 22.51a, 31.1(c), 42(b)(4), 42(b)(4-5), 55(k) (2016); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 108.

In this case, the Agency alleges that on October 11, 2018, Dean Kibler violated Sections 21(p)(1), 21(p)(3), 21(p)(4), and 55(k)(1) of the Act (415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1), 21(p)(3), 21(p)(4), and 55(k)(1) (2016)). The Agency alleges Dean Kibler caused or allowed open dumping of waste resulting in litter, open burning, and deposition of waste in standing water. The Agency also alleges Dean Kibler caused or allowed water to accumulate in used or waste tires. The Agency asks the Board to impose the statutory \$1,500 civil penalty per violation on Dean Kibler, for a total civil penalty of \$6,000. As required, the Agency served Dean Kibler with the administrative citation on November 20, 2018, which is within “60 days after the date of the observed violation.” 415 ILCS 5/31.1(b) (2016); *see also* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.300(c), 108.200(b)(1).

To contest an administrative citation, a respondent must file a petition with the Board no later than 35 days after being served with the administrative citation. If the respondent fails to do so, the Board must find that the respondent committed the violations alleged and impose the corresponding civil penalty. *See* 415 ILCS 31.1(d)(1) (2016); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.300(b),

108.204(b), 108.406. Here, any petition for review was due by December 26, 2018. Dean Kibler failed to timely file a petition. Accordingly, the Board finds that Dean Kibler violated Sections 21(p)(1), 21(p)(3), 21(p)(4), and 55(k)(1) of the Act.

The civil penalty for violating any provision of Section 21(p) or 55(k) is \$1,500 for each violation, except that the penalty amount is \$3,000 for each violation that is the person's second or subsequent adjudicated violation of that provision. *See* 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2016); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 108.500(a). Because there are four violations of Section 21(p) and 55(k) and no indication in the record that any of these is a second or subsequent adjudicated violation, the total civil penalty is \$6,000. Under Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, the Board attaches the administrative citation and makes it part of the order below.

This opinion constitutes the Board's finding of fact and conclusions of law.

ORDER

1. The Board finds that Dean Kibler violated Sections 21(p)(1), 21(p)(3), 21(p)(4), and 55(k)(1) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1), 21(p)(3), 21(p)(4), and 55(k)(1) (2016)).
2. Dean Kibler must pay a civil penalty of \$6,000 no later than Tuesday February 19, 2019, which is the first business day after the 30th day after the date of this order. Dean Kibler must pay the civil penalty by certified check, made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund. The case number, case name, and Dean Kibler's social security number or federal employer identification number must be included on the certified check.
3. Dean Kibler must send the certified check and the remittance form to:

4. Penalties unpaid within the time prescribed will accrue interest under Section 42(g) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/42(g) (2016)) at the rate set forth in Section 1003(a) of the Illinois Income Tax Act (35 ILCS 5/1003(a) (2016)).
5. Payment of this penalty does not prevent future prosecution if the violations continue.

IT IS SO ORDERED.

Section 41(a) of the Environmental Protection Act provides that final Board orders may be appealed directly to the Illinois Appellate Court within 35 days after the Board serves the order. 415 ILCS 5/41(a) (2016); *see also* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.300(d)(2), 101.906, 102.706. Illinois Supreme Court Rule 335 establishes filing requirements that apply when the Illinois Appellate Court, by statute, directly reviews administrative orders. 172 Ill. 2d R. 335. The Board's procedural rules provide that motions for the Board to reconsider or modify its final orders may be filed with the Board within 35 days after the order is received. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.520; *see also* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.902, 102.700, 102.702. Filing a motion asking that the Board reconsider this final order is not a prerequisite to appealing the order. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.902.
