6. Describe the type of pollution that you allege (e.g., air, odor, noise, water, sewer back-ups, hazardous waste) and the location of the alleged pollution. Be as specific as you reasonably can in describing the alleged pollution.

Noise pollution that exceeds the limits allowed at 35II. Adm. Code Section 901.102(a) and (b) Specifically, the sound level significantly exceeds the octave band center frequency (hertz) at 500, 100 and 2000 ranges. Sounds pressure and level measurements were made using 35II. Adm. Code Section 910.105 as guidance in gathering data.

Fugitive Particulate Matter exceeds the visible amounts allowed pursuant to Section 212.301 which indicates no visible matter. A visible amount to the point of resembling snowfall occurs and has measurable amounts to the same. Drifting of matter takes place on vehicles and yards. Mowing the yard brings any matter that has settled in the yard airborne, making the smallest of tasks such as mowing difficult.

 Describe the duration and frequency of the alleged pollution. Be as specific as you reasonably can about when you first noticed the alleged pollution, how frequently it occurs, and whether it is still continuing (include seasons of the year, dates, and times of day if known).

The pollution occurs every year beginning with the fall harvest and continues intermittently until the corn is removed from the storage units in the spring.

New grain bins were put up over the last 2 years that have increased the noise level significantly. These new bins are a very close proximity (~40') from our home. This has increased the noise level beyond those allowed in 35ll Section 901.102 (a) (b)

8. Describe any bad effects that you believe the alleged pollution has or has had on human health, on plant or animal life, on the environment, on the enjoyment of life or property, or on any lawful business or activity.

This noise and air pollution has affected my family's quality of life, caused sleep problems for my wife, son and myself, it has decreased our property value significantly.

It affects our ability to enjoy any outdoor activity to the point of even mowing as the matter gets in your eyes, nose and lungs as it gets disturbed. This only part of the health and enjoyment issues that we are facing from this. The dust from the lot as truck travel fill the air and house making breathing difficult.

The foul odor from the temporary flat land holding area is extremely pungent. The rotting corn from the harvest is not cleaned up in a timely manner to avoid this.

Describe the relief that you seek from the Board (e.g., an order 9. requiring that the respondent stop polluting, take pollution abatement measures, perform a cleanup, reimburse cleanup costs, change its operation, or pay a civil penalty (note that the Board cannot order the respondent to pay your attorney fees or any out-of-pocket expenses that you incur by pursuing an enforcement action)). I seek an order requiring the respondent to stop the noise levels allowed by the III. Adm. Code with stipulated fines (civil penalties) for any future violations, along with monitoring and reporting requirements. (Pursuant to Section (a) of the Environmental Protection Act, the civil penalties shall not exceed \$50,000 for the violation and an additional \$10,000 for each day the violation continues.) In order to demonstrate continuous compliance, the respondent should be required to provide third party noise, fugitive matter monitoring which conforms to 35ll and 212.301 codes. The testing should be conducted at the closest resident. An annual compliance report sent to the IPCB and published in a local newspaper should also be required.

For both fugitive and nonfugitive particulate matter emissions, a determination as to the presence or absence of visible emissions from emission units shall be conducted in accordance with Method 22, 40 CFR part 60, Appendix A, incorporated by reference in Section 212.113 of this Subpart, except that the length of the observing period shall be at the discretion of the observer, but not less than one minute. This Subpart shall not apply to Section 212.301 of this Part, . An annual compliance report sent to the IPCB and published in a local newspaper should also be required.

These can be accessed on the Board's website (www.ipcb.state.il.us). The following is a summary of some of the most important points in the Act and the Board's procedural rules.

Board Accepting Formal Complaint for Hearing; Motions

The Board will not accept this Formal Complaint for hearing if the Board finds that it is either "duplicative" or "frivolous" within the meaning of Section 31(d)(1) of the Act (415 ILCS 5/31(d)(1)) and Section 101.202 of the Board's procedural rules (35 III. Adm. Code 101.202 (definitions of the terms "duplicative" and "frivolous")). "Duplicative" means the complaint is identical or substantially similar to a case brought before the Board or another forum. See 35 III. Adm. Code 103.212(a) and item 10 of the Formal Complaint.
