Thank you, again, for your close review. Below, you'll find our responses to your suggested edits on Part 721. For your convenience, each response appears in bold following the corresponding suggestion.

- 1. In line 2414, strike "Parts" and add "<u>subchapter D (parts</u>". Agree to strike "Parts" as unnecessary. Disagree to the other change because it adds length but little, if any, illumination; CFR parts (absent the word "part" or "parts" except for line 2414) are referenced throughout these rules while CFR subchapters are not. See, e.g., lines 1098 and 2378.
- 2. In line 2415, after "199" add a second closing parenthesis. Disagree. See No. 1 above.
- 3. In line 2457, change the 2nd "handler" to "collection facility". Agree.
- 4. In line 2484, after "<u>CFR</u>" add "<u>subchapter C (parts</u>" and after "<u>180</u>" add ")". **Disagree. See No. 1 above.**
- 5. In lines 2624 and 2625, strike "aboveground" and add "above-ground". Disagree. The word "aboveground", like "underground", is used as an adjective throughout these rules. See, e.g., definition of "aboveground tank" at 35 Ill. Adm. Code 720.110.
