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Page 3 1 HEARING OFFICER PAULEY: Good afternoon, and welcome to this Illinois Pollution Control Board 2 3 Hearing. My name is Daniel Pauley, and I am the 4 Hearing Officer for this rules-making proceeding 5 entitled "Amendments Manifesting Requirements Special 6 Waste Hauling 35 Illinois Admin Code 809." 7 The Board Docket Number for this Rule-Making is R1918. First, you are aware, of course 8 that the Board is conducting this hearing under 9 Sections 101.600.B and 102.114 of this procedural rules 10 as a video conference hearing. 11 The Board thanks you in advance for your 12 flexibility in taking advantage of the economics and 13 14 the efficiencies that result in the use of this 15 technology. 16 Present today in from the Board in 17 Springfield with me is Board Member Brenda Carter. 18 MS. CARTER: Good afternoon. 19 HEARING OFFICER PAULEY: And in Chicago Board 20 Member Barbara Flynn Currie, the assigned Board Member 21 for this rule meeting, General Counsel, Marie Tipsord. 22 And from the Board's Technical Unit, Anand Rao and 23 Alisa Liu. And we have Ashley Renkor, an intern with 24 the Board.

Page 4 1 And am I missing anybody else off camera 2. there? 3 MS. TIPSORD: No. That's it. 4 HEARING OFFICER PAULEY: This hearing is 5 governed by the Board's procedural rules under Section 104.426 of those rules. All information that is 6 7 relevant and that is not repetitious or privileged will be admitted into the record. 8 Please bear in mind that any questions 9 10 posed today by the Board and its staff are intended solely to help develop a clear and complete record for 11 the Board's decision and do not reflect any prejudgment 12 13 of the proposal, testimony or other questions. For the sake of our court reporter in 14 15 Chicago, please speak clearly and avoid speaking at the 16 same time as another person so that the transcript is 17 clear. 18 A quick background to this rule-making, the agency filed this rule-making proposal with the 19 20 Board on November 27, 2018 in an order dated 21 January 17, 2019. The Board accepted the proposal for 22 hearing. 23 The first hearing took place on May 9, 24 2019 between Chicago and Springfield via a

In an order dated March 19, 2019 the 2 Hearing Officer directed participates to prefile 3 testimony for this hearing on or before Thursday May 23, 2019. 4 5 The Board has received no prefiled 6 testimony for this hearing. The Board did receive three public comments. PC1, from the Illinois 7 Association of Waste Water Agencies, PC2 from 8 Stericycle, Inc., and PC3 from Illini Environmental, 9 10 Inc. 11 The Board appreciates the comments and attention to the issues raised which clarify the record 12 13 for all of the participates, and those comments will be part of the record. 14 15 Under Section 102.424G of the Board's 16 procedural rules, testimony that is not prefiled is 17 allowed as time permits and where it will not prejudice 18 another participant. After the end of any testimony 19 and questions based upon it, any persons wishing to 20 offer other comment may do so as time permits. There's a sheet inside the door of each 21 22 location on which anyone can indicate that they would 23 like to offer a brief spoken comment today. I'll ask 24 one of my staff colleagues in Chicago to help with

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1	anyone there who would like to comment. Any questions
2	about procedures?

19	Economic Opportunity conduct an economic impact study
20	of proposed rules before the Board adopts the rules.
21	The Board must make either the Economic
22	Impact Study o,r, the Department's explanation for not
23	conducting one available to the public at least 20 days
24	before a public hearing.

Page 7 1 In a letter dated March 19, 2019, the 2 Board's chairman, Katie Papadimitriu, requested that 3 DCEO conducted an Economic Impact Study of this 4 rule-making proposal. The Board specifically requested a response no later than April 30, 2019. The Board 5 6 received no response from DCEO to this request. 7 Is there anyone present today who would like to testify regarding the Board's request for a 8 study in DCEO's response? 9 10 Anyone in Chicago? 11 MS. TIPSORD: No. 12 HEARING OFFICER PAULEY: Neither seeing nor 13 hearing any, let me, again, let me again, quickly 14 determine whether there is present anyone either in Springfield or Chicago who wishes to testify or comment 15 16 today. 17 So let's go off the record for just a 18 second. 19 (WHEREUPON, off the record.) 20 HEARING OFFICER PAULEY: So we'll go back on 21 the record. Thank you. 22 So we just discussed procedural issues 23 off the record. And copies of the transcript are 24 expected to be available at the Board by Thursday at

17	everyone for participating today. The second final
18	hearing is adjourned.
