

### **BOARD MEETING MINUTES**

**April 16, 2020**

## **Teleconference**

Consistent with the Governor's Executive Orders 2020-07 and 2020-10, both issued in response to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic and extended by his Executive Order 2020-18, the Board conducted this regular open meeting by teleconference.

The agenda provided dial-in information for members of the public and explained how they could use their telephones to participate in the meeting—whether by listening, speaking during Public Remarks, or both. Further, the agenda stated that the operator would ask for the name of each member of the public calling in and explain what to do for those who wished to speak. Cranbrook Farms, LLC (Water – Enforcement) – Upon receiving a stipulation, a proposed settlement agreement, and an agreed motion for relief from the hearing requirement in this water enforcement action involving a facility located in Henry County, the Board ordered publication of the required newspaper notice.	4-0
PCB 18-54	<u>Piasa Motor Fuels, Inc. v. IEPA</u> (UST Appeal) – The Board denied the Agency's motion to dismiss; partially granted and partially denied Piasa' motion for summary judgment; and partially granted and partially denied the Agency's crossmotion for summary judgment.	4-0
PCB 19-112	People of the State of Illinois v. Marino Development LLC and A-W-Bennett Enterprises, Inc. (Land – Enforcement) – The Board granted the People's unopposed motions to deem facts admitted and for summary judgment. The Board therefore found that respondent Marino Development violated numerous provisions of the Environmental Protection Act and the Board's regulations. The Board also ordered respondent Marino Development toboth pay a civil penalty of \$25,000 and cease and desist from further violations.	4-0
