Let the record show that it's now 11:52 on a hearing that was noticed for 11:45 a.m. today. This is a hearing being held to satisfy federal SIP requirements because the end product of this rulemaking will be a SIP revision.

Again, I am the hearing officer. My name is Mike McCambridge. The Board Member assigned to this is Ms. Currie, who is on the

And I have Don Brown, the Clerk of the Board. Are you there, Don? Oh, I see a DB box here, but I don't get verification. Now I have a box that I can't read. Oh, Vanessa Horton is down here. Attorney for the Board, yes?

MS. HORTON: I am here. I am present.

HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: So you
acknowledge --
MS. HORTON: I do.
HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: Okay. Now I have a call-in user 3. Could that person identify?

MR. DAVIS: That might be me. Rory Davis with the Illinois EPA.

HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: Okay.
MR. DAVIS: I'm not --
HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: Okay.
I have a box --
MR. DAVIS: I had one.
HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: I have a box with your name on it. I don't know how I missed it. These things shuffle as we go. But there are two boxes here
that I can't quite --
MR. BROWN: You know, it might --

acknowledged, but there are two other boxes open here that \(I\) can't identify. One is call-in user 3, and the other \(I\) can't read because of the record -- the recorder button, and I don't want to mess with that.

CHAIRMAN CURRIE: You certainly named everybody that's showing up on my screen.

HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: Okay. Yeah, call-in user 3 then. There's something underneath the recorder here, and that was Chairman Currie that just spoke, correct?

CHAIRMAN CURRIE: Yes. Just to say that it looks to me as if we've covered --

HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: Okay.
CHAIRMAN CURRIE: -- everybody
that's listed as a participant on my screen.

HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: Okay.
Very good. It's a little tedious, I know, but with everybody being remote, \(I\) wanted to make sure it was clear.

CHAIRMAN CURRIE: Sure.
HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: The
Board -- this is the R19-14 (R20-3, R20-11)
Consolidated National Ambient Air Standards or NAAQX -- or NAAQS update. It covers the first half or second half of 2 -- 2018 and the first and second halves of 2019.

During the period, USEPA,
October 16th, 2018, had air designations under the 2015 NAAQS for ozone for -- the USEPA corrected earlier actions in which it had excluded McHenry and Monroe counties. They add it with the October 16th action, and the Board -- no Board action is required on that.

December 27th, 2018, USEPA
redesignated areas in Illinois formerly
unclassifiable as unclassifiable attainment for the 2012 primary annual average NAAQS for fine particulates. March 18th, 2019, the USEPA decided to retain the existing 2010 primary NAAQS for
sulfur dioxide. No Board action is required on that one.

On March 29th, 2019, USEPA designated a new federal equivalent method for ozone in ambient air. The Board has to incorporate that method into the rules.

May 28th, 2019, USEPA res- --
designated the Metro East area to attainment for the 1997 primary and secondary NAAQS for fine particulates. That means that it -- that NAAQS no longer applies within Illinois, and this action would remove the 1997 primary and annual average NAAQS for PO -- or for fine particulates from the Illinois rules.

May 28th, 2019, USEPA
incorporated or it designated a new federal reference method for carbon monoxide and ambient air. The Board has to include that in the Illinois rules.

August 23rd, 2019, USEPA
reclassified the Chicago/Naperville area from moderate to serious non-attainment for the 2008 primary and secondary NAAQS for ozone.

September 13th, 2019, USEPA
reconsidered its 2016 definition of Williamson County as non-attainment for the 2010 NAAQS for SO2 and designated that -- that county as attainment for the NAAQS for sulfur dioxide.

That means as a result of that action, the only area in Illinois to which the sulfur dioxide, the NAAQS would apply, is Macon County, and the Board has proposed revising the rule to reflect that.

September 26th, 2019, USEPA incorporated -- or designated a new federal reference method for nitrogen dioxide in the ambient air. The Board needs to change the rules to reflect that.

Now, on December 15th, 2019, USEPA updated its list of designated reference and equivalent methods. The result of that update is that it incorporates all of the March 29th, 2019, 28th, 2019, and September 26, 2019 federal actions into this document. So the Board's update of the incorporation by reference of that document will incorporate all three of those federal changes.

The -- I didn't say it, but the Board's May 21st, 2020 proposal for public comment
appears -- appeared in the June 5th, 2020 Illinois Register. That started the public comment period. That public comment period would end 45 days later on July 20th. However, I am going to extend that to allow two weeks after this hearing for people to submit any comments resulting from this hearing so that the public comment period would end on August 31 st of this year just over two weeks from now.

So far the Board has received public comments from JCAR, which included just some minor correction to the -- well, it basically -- a very minor correction reflecting inapplicability outside -- in Illinois outside of Macon County.

We also received comments from
the Illinois EPA and basically, Illinois EPA pointed out an error in the opinion that will be corrected. It relates to the 1997 primary and secondary NAAQS for PM 2, fine particulates.

And that's all I have on this, besides the target right now is to put this rulemaking for final adoption on the Board's agenda. I believe that date is August 13th, 2020.

So make sure that any comments that are wanted are submitted before the close of public comment period on August 31st of this month or next month -- or July 31st. I'm sorry. July 31st is the deadline. Make sure comments are in by that time.

Now, does anyone wish to add to the record? Please identify yourself, and state what you wish to add.

Anyone in Chicago? MS. TIPSORD: No one. HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: Seeing nobody? MS. TIPSORD: No. HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE:

Anybody in the Springfield office? MS. GODIKSEN: I have a question. This is Annet Godiksen with the Agency. HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: Yes. MS. GODIKSEN: In our comments that -- in our comments that we filed, we asked for clarification for Questions 1 and 2, which we didn't quite understand. Do you have that clarification?

HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: Not --
not right at the moment. I was seeking --
THE COURT REPORTER: I can't hear you. I'm sorry. Mr. McCambridge, could you say that again?

HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: You wish what repeated?

THE COURT REPORTER: Your answer. At the beginning it was blocked out by noise. So I'm sorry. Could you --

HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: Okay. Not at this moment. I looked at them. I do know that the two questions sought clarification in an area where the Board does not directly participate with USEPA, as does the Agency.

And if you wish, I will pull
that up here and take a second look. Let me see here, if this thing could just respond to me positively. Okay. That's a little slow here because of bandwidth problems, but I -- there we go. Okay. There we go. I've got the text now. The two Board's questions were: Do USEPA area -- Agency designations to ozone, the ozone NAAQS, have any impact on the effect of the

ozone NAAQS? Do USEPA's area designations for the 2012 NAAQS for fine particulate have any effect on the 1987 or 1997 NAAQS?

MS. GODIKSEN: Yes.
HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: Those were the questions. As far as I know, to inform the Board, there are no revocation clauses in the ozone NAAQS. So they can remain effective,
notwithstanding updated NAAQS at issue, until
USEPA expressly removes them from the rules, or I think once with ozone the revocation occurred through the implementation rule. The question was basically to clarify that understanding.

Does the Agency wish to offer anything to clarify or does that -- first off, the question is -- the first question is, does that clarify the question?

MS. GODIKSEN: Rory, do you -- does that clarify anything for you? Rory, can you hear me?

MS. GODIKSEN: Rory, did that
clarify the question?
MR. DAVIS: This is Rory Davis with the Illinois EPA. I believe it does. If -- if the question is -- well, I guess not. So is the question about newly desig- -- new designations having impact on old NAAQS if they have not been revoked?

HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: Right. Many of the other NAAQS are structured so that they are revoked by operational law when some -something else occurs, like USEPA designating an area or, you know, I can't remember. There was another thing that caused it.

But I don't see that in the ozone NAAQS. So that the ozone NAAQS, older ozone NAAQS, remain effective until such time as USEPA takes some express action to revoke them, and I have seen that occur -- I think I saw it occur once through the implementation rule.

Am I correct in what I am
saying?

MR. DAVIS: I believe you are, but I will have to -- we will have to check on -- you know, we can look at the record, too, the transcripts. I believe that's true. I don't want to commit right now to answering that, but --

HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: Okay.
MR. DAVIS: I believe that's -- I believe you're correct. But let us double check --

HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: Okay.
MR. DAVIS: -- in the instance of the ozone and the PM. So it's the same question in the second question also.

HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: Well, the second question is a little more specific, the two specific -- the 1987 and 1997 NAAQS for fine particulates.

Do the area designations involve your -- affect those NAAQS? And I am trying to -right off the top, I know that it was sulfur dioxide and one other NAAQS that were in this rulemaking were partially revoked as to Illinois. I don't remember right off the top of my head right now what that other NAAQS was, but the basic

question was, does the area designation with the 2012 NAAQS affect -- or for fine particulates affect the '87 or '97 NAAQS for fine particulates?

MR. DAVIS: I don't believe so, but we -- the Agency will double check, and now with the clarification of the question, we will -HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: As I mentioned, because the Agency participates directly with USEPA on state authorizations, sometimes it's desirable to seek clarification from the Agency, and this is one of those instances. And that was why those two questions were posited.

And does -- if that -- if that offers the clarity, we can continue from here and leave the subject. Does it?

MR. DAVIS: I believe so, yes. HEARING OFFICER McCAMBRIDGE: Okay.

Very good. Does anyone else have anything to ask or -- or to submit to the record?
