## ILLINOIS POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD September 17, 2020

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IN THE MATTER OF: WASTEWATER PRETREATMENT UPDATE, USEPA AMENDMENTS (January 1, 2020 through June 30, 2020)

R21-8 (Identical-in-Substance Rulemaking - Water)

Proposed Rule. Proposal for Public Comment.

OPINION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD (by C.M. Santos):

The Board today proposes amendments to Illinois regulations that are "identical in substance" (IIS) to wastewater pretreatment regulations adopted by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) during the first half of 2020.

Sections 7.2 and 13.3 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (Act) (415 ILCS 5/7.2 and 13.3 (2018)) provide for quick adoption by the Board of regulations that are "identical in substance" to regulations that USEPA adopts to implement sections 307(b), (c), and (d) and 402(b)(8) and (b)(9) of the federal Clean Water Act (CWA) (33 U.S.C. §§ 1317(b), (c), and (d) and 1412(b)(8) and (b)(9) (2018)). Section 13.3 of the Act also provides that Title VII of the Act and Section 5 of the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act (5 ILCS 100/5-35 and 5-40 (2018)) do not apply to the Board's adoption of identical-in-substance regulations.

The federal wastewater pretreatment standards implement these sections of the CWA and are found in segments of 40 C.F.R. 401, 403, 405 through 415, 417 through 430, 432 through 455, 457 through 461, 463 through 469, and 471.

USEPA took one action related to wastewater pretreatment during the first half of 2020 that requires Board attention. The USEPA action requires the Board to update one incorporation by reference in 35 III. Adm. Code 310.107. The Board further proposes updating other incorporations by reference as a routine matter to keep them current; repealing 35 III. Adm. Code 310.930, which may be obsolete; and making limited corrections in the incorporations by reference.

The Board will publish the proposed amendments in the *Illinois Register* and will receive public comments for at least 45 days after publication. The Board expects to adopt final rules long before the statutory due date of April 15, 2021. The Board specifically requests comment on two specific aspects of the rules.

This opinion has five main segments. First, the Board provides its timetable for completing this rulemaking. Second, the Board identifies USEPA's action that resulted in this rulemaking and discusses the proposed amendments. Third, the Board finds that limited corrections and amendments are needed and considers repealing a provision regarding a program that USEPA terminated. Finally, the Board invites public comment on the proposed amendments, which are found in the order following this opinion.

## TIMETABLE TO COMPLETE RULEMAKING

Under Section 7.2(b) of the Act (415 ILCS 5/7.2(b) (2018)), the Board must complete this rulemaking within one year after the corresponding federal action by April 15, 2021.

Adopting this proposal for public comment today may allow the Board to complete rulemaking action as early as December 15, 2020.

## **DISCUSSION**

The discussion includes two segments. In the first, the Board considers incorporating into the Illinois wastewater pretreatment regulations amendments adopted by USEPA. In the second, the Board considers various corrections and amendments that do not derive from the USEPA amendments.

#### **Federal Action Implemented**

The USEPA action that requires an amendment to the Illinois regulations is summarized below.

<u>April 15, 2020 (85 Fed. Reg. 20873)</u>: USEPA updated its NPDES digital reporting rule as it relates to reporting for municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4s).

The USEPA action affects implementation of wastewater pretreatment standards: USEPA amended general reporting provisions that relate to wastewater pretreatment programs.

#### Updating the Incorporation by Reference for NPDES e-Reporting

USEPA adopted its NPDES digital reporting rule in 2015. 80 Fed. Reg. 64064 (Oct. 22, 2015). The rule embraced reporting under all NPDES programs, including MS4 and wastewater pretreatment. The Board incorporated the wastewater pretreatment-related portions into the Illinois pretreatment rules in 2017. <u>Wastewater Pretreatment Update, USEPA Amendments</u> (July 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015), R16-9 (Jan. 19, 2017).

USEPA reporting rules required data listed in appendix A to 40 C.F.R. 127. The Board incorporated appendix A by reference into the Illinois rules.

USEPA's April 15, 2020 MS4-related amendments revised general reporting-related entries in appendix A to 40 C.F.R. 127. The Illinois pretreatment rules rely on the general reporting portions of appendix A.

Updating the version of appendix A to 40 C.F.R. 127 incorporated by reference to include the April 15, 2020 USEPA amendments will complete Board action on them.

## Amendments and Corrections to Background Text

The Board finds that it is necessary to propose limited amendments and corrections to background text that are not based on the USEPA action described above. The corrections include updating all incorporations by reference of *Code of Federal Regulations* and *United States Code* provisions and removing 35 Ill. Adm. Code 310.930 as obsolete.

<u>Removing the Rule for Project XL Pilot Projects.</u> USEPA initiated the Regulatory Reinvention (XL) Community Pilot Program (Project XL) in 1995. USEPA described the program as follows:

EPA will provide an opportunity to test flexible and innovative strategies in the implementation of environmental regulatory requirements in exchange for a commitment to achieve greater environmental quality than would have been realized under traditional approaches. 60 Fed. Reg. 55569 (Nov. 1, 1995).

In 2001, USEPA adopted 40 C.F.R. § 403.20 for Project XL wastewater pretreatment pilot projects at the request of five publicly owned treatment works (POTWs), including the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRDGC). 66 Fed. Reg. 50334, 50336 (Oct. 3, 2001).

The Board incorporated 40 C.F.R. § 403.20 into the Illinois rules as 35 Ill. Adm. Code 310.930 on petition of MWRDGC in 2002. <u>Wastewater Pretreatment Update, USEPA</u> <u>Amendments (October 3, 2001)</u>, R02-9 (Mar. 7, 2002).

In 2004, MWRDGC agreed to terminate its Project XL pilot final project agreement, as acknowledged by USEPA.<sup>1</sup> USEPA terminated the Project XL program in 2009. 74 Fed. Reg. 22741 (May 14, 2009). USEPA has since removed obsolete rules implementing Project XL.<sup>2</sup>

The Board removes 35 Ill. Adm. Code 310.930 as obsolete. Because Section 310.930 is the only section in Subpart L of the Board's pretreatment program rules, the Board will seek JCAR approval to recodify Part 310 by removing Subpart L: Federal Project XL Agreements.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

The Board invites public comments on this proposal. The Board will receive public comments for at least 45 days following the proposal's publication in the *Illinois Register*. The Board specifically requests comments on the following:

- 1. Does updating the incorporation by reference of appendix A to 40 C.F.R. 127 fully incorporate the necessary elements of USEPA's April 14, 2020 action into the Illinois wastewater pretreatment rules?
- 2. Is it appropriate to remove 35 Ill. Adm. Code 310.930 as obsolete?

#### **IIS Rulemaking Addendum**

The IIS Rulemaking Addendum to the Proposed Opinion and Order of the Board (IIS-RA (P)) fully lists the differences between the text of the USEPA amendments and the Board's language in this rulemaking. Entries in the tables briefly explain the differences. The first table lists deviations from the text of federal rules. The second table lists corrections and clarifications to rules not prompted by USEPA amendments, but which the Board finds are needed.

The Board included the IIS-RA (P) in the docket for this rulemaking, available on the Board's website (www.pcb.illinois.gov). The Board directs interested persons to the IIS-RA (P) for information about deviations from the federal text and amendments not directly derived from current federal amendments.

#### <u>ORDER</u>

The Board directs the Clerk to provide notice in the *Illinois Register* of the appended proposed amendments to the Illinois wastewater pretreatment regulations at 35 Ill. Adm. Code 310.

## SUBPART L: FEDERAL PROJECT XL AGREEMENTS

# Section 310.930 Federally Approved Pretreatment Program Reinvention Pilot Projects Under Project XL (Repealed)

Once a POTW has entered into a federally approved pretreatment program reinvention pilot project under Project XL, the Agency may, by a permit issued pursuant to Section 39 of the Act, allow that POTW to implement a pretreatment program that includes legal authorities and requirements that are different than the administrative requirements otherwise applicable under this Part.

- a) The POTW must submit any such alternative requirements as a substantial program modification in accordance with the procedures outlined in Subpart K of this Part. The approved modified program must be incorporated as an enforceable part of the POTW's NPDES permit before the POTW may implement it.
- b) The Agency must include a reopener clause in the POTW's NPDES permit that directs the POTW to discontinue implementing the approved alternative requirements and resume implementation of its previously approved pretreatment program if the Agency determines that the primary objectives of the local pilot pretreatment program embodied in the Project XL agreement are not being met or the Project XL agreement expires or is otherwise terminated pursuant to its own terms.
