## POST-HEARING COMMENTS OF THE ILLINOIS ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY

NOW COMES the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency ("Illinois EPA" or "Agency"), by its attorneys, and respectfully submits its post-hearing comments in the above rulemaking proceeding. The Illinois Pollution Control Board ("Board") held two hearings in this matter, at which the Agency provided testimony and answered questions from the Board. The hearings were virtually held on June 25, 2020, and September 10, 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Agency submitted this rulemaking proposal in order to comply with Section 9.16(n) (text from P.A. 101-22)<sup>1</sup> of the Environmental Protection Act ("Act"), a new section of the Act signed into law on June 21, 2019. The Agency proposes monitoring of ethylene oxide levels over a six-month period to determine ambient levels in the State. The samples will be collected at five different sites, representing urban, suburban, and rural areas, and samples will be collected every 12 days. The chosen monitoring sites are Northbrook, Schiller Park, Nilwood, Alton, and Bondville. As this is a six-month monitoring program, the Agency's proposal also includes a provision sunsetting the regulations after 24 months.

#### The Monitoring Sites Will Not Be Impacted by Permitted Ethylene Oxide Emission Sources

The Testimony of David Bloomberg, prefiled for the first hearing, provided information about how the monitoring locations were chosen. Ex. 1 at 2. The Board's pre-filed questions and questions posed at the June 10 hearing sought clarification on the location of these monitors as related to their proximity to known ethylene oxide sources. *See* Ex. 2 at 1-2; Transcript ("Tr.") at 19-23. The Agency testified that ethylene oxide is a highly localized pollutant, meaning that any effects occur near the source of emissions. Tr. at 19, 24. Thus, transport is not an issue with ethylene oxide, and the Agency has no reason to believe that the chosen monitor sites will be impacted by any of the permitted ethylene oxide sources listed in Table 1 of the Technical Support Document. *Id*. The monitoring conducted will allow the Agency to determine the background concentrations of ethylene oxide.

#### The Board Should Adopt the Proposed New 35 Ill. Adm. Code 249

The Agency requests that the Board adopt the proposed regulations. The Agency respectfully requests that the Board utilize the language initially proposed by the Agency, with the exception of those changes agreed to and suggested by the Agency in its answer in Questions 9 and 10 to the Board's Prefiled Questions. *See* Ex. 3 at 7-9. No other participants filed testimony, posed questions to the Agency witnesses, or suggested any changes to the proposed regulatory language. The proposed regulations adhere to the requirements set out in the statute and are technically feasible and economically reasonable. As such, these regulations should be adopted.
