NOTICE OF ADOPTED RULES

- Summary and Purpose of Rulemaking: New Section 9.16(n) of the Environmental 15) Protection Act (Act) (415 ILCS 5/9.16(n) amended in P.A. 101-22, eff. June 21, 2019) requires the IEPA to develop a system to ascertain ambient baseline levels of ethylene oxide (EtO) across Illinois. EtO is a flammable gas that is used in two ways: 1) it can be combined with other chemicals, resulting in a wide array of consumer products, including detergents, solvents, plastics, antifreeze, textiles, and adhesives; and2) it is used as a sterilizing agent for medical equipment and a fumigating agent for food products. EtO is also an unintended byproduct of certain processes, including combustion. Sources of EtO emissions include plants, microbes, human exhalation, cigarette smoke, automobile exhaust, and industrial sources (e.g. commercial sterilizers and chemical facilities). EtO is one of 187 Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs) regulated under Section 112 of the Clean Air Act (42 U. S. C. §7412). This rule is proposed for the specific purpose of satisfying the statutory mandate to collect ambient monitoring data for EtO in order to supplement the monitoring being conducted by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA). The proposal provides a mechanism to collect ambient air samples to determine the background levels of EtO throughout the State. Id.
