Control Board hearing on October 7th, 2021. My name is Mark Kaminski and I am the Hearing Officer for this rulemaking proceeding entitled Rulemaking for Drycleaner Environmental Response Trust Fund Act Proposal to Add 35 Ill. Adm. Code Part 1501, Repeal 35 Ill. Adm. Code Part 1500, and Repeal 2 Ill. Adm. Code Part 3100.

The Board docket number for this rulemaking is R21-19. Also present today from the Board are Board members Van Wie and Santos. Board staff in attendance are Daniel Pauley, Essence Brown and Tim Fox.

This is the second hearing in this rulemaking. The first hearing was held in Springfield on September 9, 2021. During the first hearing, pre-filed testimony was provided and questions were submitted and asked and answered.

HEARING OFFICER KAMINSKI: Please proceed.

MS. SLAYTON: My name is Victoria Slayton. I received my undergraduate degree from the University of Illinois - Springfield in 2014 and my master's degree in public administration from the University of Illinois - Springfield in 2016. I have worked for the State of Illinois in one capacity or another since August of 2014.

Pertinent to today's hearing, I
have worked for the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency since October of 2018 as an accountant in the Bureau of Land's Waste Reduction and Compliance Section up until a recent promotion to Executive I as of September 2021.

A majority of what $I$ do on $a$ day-to-day basis includes analyzing financial assurance mechanisms for solid waste, hazardous waste, used tire, consent orders and compost facilities, reviewing, processing and approving delegated county invoices, conducting landfill fee audits as necessary and leading the financial

assurance program and administration of the Drycleaner Environmental Response Trust Fund program since its implementation as of July 1, 2020.

And as program administrator of the Drycleaner Environmental Response Trust Fund program, basically everything touches my desk in regards to licensing, insurance policies, budgets and reimbursement requests.

For the record, is there anyone present here today who did not pre-file testimony for this second hearing and wishes to offer testimony? At this point, we would move on to comments.
