NOTICE OF HEARING

On August 16, 2021, the Illinois Environmental Regulatory Group (IERG) proposed updates to Board rules with the intention of updating the rules to make them consistent and current with the Clean Air Act and federal Non-Attainment New Source Review program.

The Board will conduct two hearings to allow IERG, IEPA and any other interested participants to testify and comment on the merits and economic impact of the proposed rule. *See* 415 ILCS 5/28(a) (2020); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 102.412(a).

If adopted by the Board, the Illinois EPA will submit proposed amendments to Part 203 and Part 204 to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) for review and approval as a State Implementation Plan (SIP) revision to satisfy Clean Air Act ("CAA") requirements regarding Nonattainment New Source Review and Prevention of Significant Deterioration. 42 U.S.C. §§7410(a)(2)(C), and 7471 and 7502. The revisions submitted to U.S. EPA will include not only the amendments to current regulatory provisions under this proposal, but also the newly created provisions, as well as an analysis demonstrating that the proposal does not interfere with attainment or maintenance of any applicable National Ambient Air Quality Standard, reasonable further progress, or any other applicable requirement of the CAA. This notice is intended to satisfy the requirements of Section 110(l) of the CAA, 42 U.S.C. §7410(l), regarding public notice for SIP submittals.

The Board's procedural rules provide that "[a]ny Board hearing may be held by videoconference." The rules list factors that hearing officers consider when determining whether to hold a hearing by videoconference. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.600(b).

Based on the nature of IERG's proposal, the Board does not expect the required hearings to be unusually lengthy, complex, or contentious. The Board expects that its videoconference facilities will accommodate attendance and participation at these hearings. Finally, videoconference hearings would reduce the time and cost of travel for the Board and such potential participants as the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) and regulated entities. Having considered these factors, the Board concludes to conduct both of the required hearings by videoconference between Chicago and Springfield. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.600(b).

HEARING OFFICER ORDER

Hearings and Pre-filed Testimony

Participants pre-filing testimony for either of the two hearings are directed to serve it on all persons on the Service List at the time of pre-filing. See 35 Ill. Adm. Code 102.424(c). Before filing any document with the Board's Clerk, please obtain the current version of the Service List through the Clerk's Office On-Line (COOL) on the Board's Web site (https://pcb.illinois.gov/) or by calling the Clerk's Office at 312-814-3461. Documents may generally be served by e-mail if the recipient has consented to e-mail service and has not revoked consent. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.1060. Participants in this rulemaking are encouraged to provide consent to e-mail service of documents. See 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.1070(a).

All persons wishing to testify at either hearing will be sworn in and subject to questioning. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 102.428(a). At both hearings, all pre-filed testimony will be entered into the record as if read. See 35 Ill. Adm. Code 102.424(f). A brief introduction or summary of the pre-filed testimony will be allowed if a witness wishes to provide one before responding to questions.

For these videoconference hearings, the Board's rules require that any document to be offered as a hearing exhibit must be received by the Clerk's Office at least 24 hours before the scheduled start of the hearing. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 102.424(h). If not filed at least 24 hours before the scheduled start of the videoconference hearing, the document will not be admitted as an exhibit at the hearing but may be filed as a public comment after the hearing. *Id*.

Unless the Board, hearing officer, Clerk, or procedural rules provide otherwise, all documents in this proceeding must be filed electronically through COOL. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.302(h), 101.1000(c), 101.Subpart J.

First Hearing

Participants who intend to testify at the first hearing are directed to pre-file all their testimony and related exhibits no later than Thursday, January 6, 2022. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 102.424(a). To expedite the first hearing, participants who have questions based on pre-filed testimony are urged to pre-file those questions no later than January 27, 2022. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 104.424(b). If a participant wishes to pre-file answers they may do so through the Board's COOL system.

Although Section 27 of the Act (415 ILCS 5/27 (2020)) does not set the order of the hearing, the hearing officers intend to begin the first hearing with witnesses who pre-filed testimony. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 102.428(c). After those witnesses have testified and responded to questions, participants who did not pre-file testimony may testify as time allows.

Participants wishing to offer a public comment will be allowed to do so as time allows before the end of a hearing. Participants may also file post-hearing comments electronically. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 102.108(b).

Second Hearing

Participants who intend to testify at the second hearing are directed to pre-file all their testimony and related exhibits no later than Thursday, March 10, 2022. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 102.424(a).

The hearing officers intend to begin the second hearing with any participants who prefiled testimony for the first hearing but were not able to testify and respond to questions before the end of that hearing. Next, participants who pre-filed testimony for the second hearing will present that testimony and respond to questions. Participants who did not pre-file testimony for the second hearing will be allowed to testify and respond to questions as time permits. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 104.424(g).

Participants wishing to offer a public comment will be allowed to do so as time allows before the end of a hearing. Participants may also file post-hearing comments electronically. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 102.108(b).

In a letter dated September 9, 2021, the Board's Chair requested that the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) conduct an economic impact study of the amended proposal and respond to the request by October 31, 2022. In a letter dated October 22, 2021, DCEO declined to perform an economic impact study. At the second hearing, the Board will receive testimony on DCEO's decision not to conduct an economic impact study. See 415 ILCS 5/27(b) (2020).

Service and Notice Lists

The Board has established and will maintain both a Notice List and Service List for this proceeding. The Notice List includes participants who wish to receive only the Board's opinions and orders and hearing officer orders. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 102.422(a). The Service List includes participants who expect to participate more actively and wish also to receive other filings such as pre-filed testimony. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 102.422(b).

Note that any interested person may request electronic notice of filings by providing an email address though COOL under this docket number R22-17. This electronic notice includes notice of filing of documents that are not typically provided to persons on the Notice List. In addition, COOL provides links to documents filed with the Board, and those documents can be viewed, downloaded, and printed free of charge as soon as they are posted to the Board's web site.
