St. Mary Fuel Co. d/b/a Clark (Air – Enforcement) – In this enforcement action involving a Cook County gas station, the Board granted the People's motion to withdraw their motion to deem facts admitted and for summary judgment. Further, upon receiving a stipulation, a proposed settlement, and an agreed motion for relief from the hearing requirement, the Board directed the Clerk to provide the required newspaper notice.	5-0 roll call vote
PCB 22-58	People of the State of Illinois v. Elite Car Wash, Inc. (Air – Enforcement) – In this enforcement action concerning a Cook County gas station, the Board granted relief from the hearing requirement of Section 31(c)(1) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/31(c)(1) (2020)), accepted a stipulation and proposed settlement, and ordered Elite Car Wash to pay a \$5,000 civil penalty and to cease and desist from further violations.	5-0 roll call vote
PCB 22-96	People of the State of Illinois v. The County of Cook (Air – Enforcement) – In this enforcement action concerning a Cook County health care facility, the Board granted relief from the hearing requirement of Section 31(c)(1) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/31(c)(1) (2020)), accepted a stipulation and proposed settlement, and ordered the County of Cook to pay a \$10,000 civil penalty and to cease and desist from further violations.	5-0 roll call vote
PCB 23-1	People of the State of Illinois v. Minhaj Ahmed, d/b/a Tumara Food Mart, Inc. (Air – Enforcement) – In this enforcement action concerning a Cook County gas station, the Board granted relief from the hearing requirement of Section 31(c)(1) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/31(c)(1) (2020)), accepted a stipulation and proposed settlement, and ordered Ahmed to pay a \$5,000 civil penalty and to cease and desist from further violations.	5-0 roll call vote

PCB 23-7	People of the State of Illinois v. Millers Ready-Mix, LLC (Air – Enforcement) – In this enforcement action concerning a Cook County concrete ready-mix batch facility, the Board granted relief from the hearing requirement of Section 31(c)(1) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/31(c)(1) (2020)), accepted a stipulation and proposed settlement, and ordered Millers Ready-Mix to pay a \$10,000 civil penalty and to cease and desist from further violations.	5-0 roll call vote
PCB 23-27	People of the State of Illinois v. Mohammed Siddiqui, individually and d/b/a BP (Air – Enforcement) – The Board accepted for hearing the People's complaint concerning Siddiqui's gas station in Cook County.	5-0 roll call vote
PCB 23-28	People of the State of Illinois v. Shabeena Afridi, individually and d/b/a One Stop Gas Station, and Arathi Property, Inc. (Air – Enforcement) – The Board accepted for hearing the People's complaint concerning a Cook County gas station allegedly owned and operated formerly by Afridi and currently by Arathi Property.	5-0 roll call vote
PCB 23-29	West Central FS, Inc. – Wataga v. Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Water – Tax Certification) – The Board found and certified that West Central FS' agrichemical containment facilities in Knox County are pollution control facilities for preferential tax treatment under the Property Tax Code (35 ILCS 200/11-10 (2020)).	5-0 roll call vote
PCB 23-30	47 Finish LLC v. Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Water – Tax Certification) – The Board found and certified that 47 Finish's livestock waste handling facilities in Livingston County are pollution control facilities for preferential tax treatment under the Property Tax Code (35 ILCS 200/11-10 (2020)).	5-0 roll call vote
PCB 23-31	<u>Travis and Jennifer Hobby v. Illinois Environmental Protection</u> <u>Agency</u> (Water – Tax Certification) – The Board found and certified that Travis and Jennifer Hobby's livestock waste handling facilities in Hancock County are pollution control facilities for preferential tax treatment under the Property Tax Code (35 ILCS 200/11-10 (2020)).	5-0 roll call vote
PCB 23-32	People of the State of Illinois v. Lake Petroleum Inc. (Air – Enforcement) – Upon receiving a complaint, a stipulation, a proposed settlement, and an agreed motion for relief from the hearing requirement in this enforcement action involving a McHenry County gas station, the Board accepted the complaint and directed the Clerk to provide the required newspaper notice of the settlement-related filings.	5-0 roll call vote
