Aurora Redevelopment Company, <u>LLC</u> (Air – Enforcement) – Having received a complaint, a stipulation, a proposed settlement, and an agreed motion for relief from the hearing requirement in this enforcement action involving a Kane County gas station, the Board accepted the complaint and directed the Clerk to provide the required newspaper notice of the settlement-related filings.	4-0 roll call vote
