

interfering with the enjoyment of the life of the residents in the area in violation of the Board regulations.

The People ask the Board to find that IDOT has violated Section 24 of the Act (415 ILCS 5/24 (2020)) and Sections 900.102 and 901.102 of the Board regulations (35 Ill. Adm. Code 900.102, 901.102), and to order IDOT to comply with the requirements of the Act and Board regulations and cease and desist from any further violations of the Act and Board regulations that were the subject of the complaint. The People also ask that the Board award the People their costs, including attorney fees, expert witness and consultant fees expended by the People in pursuit of this action.

The Board finds that the complaint does meet the content requirements of the Board's procedural rules; however, the Board directs that an amended complaint be filed within 30 days of the date of this order. The amended complaint must be filed under the Title VIII of the Act and in accordance with the Board's procedural rules. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.202, 103.204(c), (f), 103.212(c). The Board also grants IDOT's motion for extension of time to file a motion in response to the complaint. The Board grants IDOT 30 days from the date of filing of the amended complaint to file a motion to dismiss the complaint. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.506, 101.522. IDOT may also ask the hearing officer for a further extension after the filing of the amended complaint.
