There were another 38 cases over the last week.

Customers Billed to Become Current

Last December, about 1,600 water/sewer customers were invoiced in full to become current, and given until September 30, 2022 to pay that bill. Only about 175 customers did not pay in full. Late notices, with no late fees applied, were mailed to each of those households.

Forty-seven customers have paid no portion of their back-billed balance, 34 of whom have not even been paying their March 1, May 1, July 1, Sept 1, 2022 bills for current usage. For this subgroup of 47 customers, should their accounts not be paid by October 19, 2022, they will receive a shut off notice, which will provide for the termination of water service on October 26. 2022 should their account balances remain unpaid.

I previously shared that there is a group of customers who asked to have their accounts brought current prior to the December 2021 billing. Twenty-nine customers' accounts remain unpaid, and letters were mailed reminding them that they were to have paid those bills upon receipt; 15 paid. The remaining 13 (one is being handled with DuPage County) will be sent Notices of Violation and, should they not be paid within two weeks, they will be required to appear at an administrative hearing. If the bill is paid prior to the hearing date, the case will be non-suited.

We will slowly work on the other customers who have outstanding balances; at some point we will need to initiate the water service termination process.

The case was continued to January 10th at which time the ZBA denied the rezoning request 7-0. Mary Dickson's presentation is attached, it is quite good and she did an excellent job at the hearing. The applicant's attorney plans to attend Monday's meeting to convince the City Council not to approve the formal objection. However, the City has a Pre-annexation Agreement with 14 property owners in this area, including the subject property, that calls for residential and not commercial zoning, and all parties have an obligation to ensure its terms are followed.

Development Updates

NIMEC Bid for Electric Pricing

The City Council will be asked as in the past to pre-approve the City Administrator's authority to execute the contracts upon bid opening (March 2) to secure the lowest price, with an after the fact formal approval at a future meeting.

Park Plan - Weyrauch Street

The City's consultant is working on the PowerPoint presentation for the Public Affairs Committee meeting, which will show an overview of work-to-date, the proposed plan, and the suggested park names.

Also, the City did get allocated the \$2M via the Community Project Funding initiative for which the City applied via Representative Casten's Office; when combined with our \$500,000 local match, it will mean some good progress towards achieving the ultimate outcome. That said, despite listing four times in the application that construction on the park would not begin for another three or so years, the money needs to be used within 12 months of signing the Grant Agreement. I have talked with Bruce White, and reps from Weston Solutions and IEMA, and all think we can create a framework to accomplish all of our objectives, so stay tuned. Regardless, this is a huge win for WC.

Cannabis Operation in Unincorporated West Chicago

The DuPage County Zoning Board of Appeals began its review a rezoning request from E-R to B-2 on a parcel of land immediately east of the former Planters' Palette property. The owner wants to eventually establish a marijuana dispensary, and have a cultivation center in the rear of the property. The case was continued to January 10th at which time the ZBA denied the rezoning request 7-0. The DuPage County Development Committee approved the rezoning application last Tuesday by a 4-2 vote; it is set to go to the County Board this coming Tuesday. We are filing a Complaint for Injunctive Relief and Breach of our Pre-annexation Agreement and are seeking a hearing before the County Board meets on Tuesday.

Great Western Trail Volunteer Clean-up

Cascade

Despite a more positive update a few months ago, a representative of the owner of the Cascade property now reports that costs continue to increase and this has slowed consideration of redoing an outdoor theater. The costs for the lift station have increased considerably. The owner did renew the business registration though for the theater. The rep asked about the City's thoughts on a spec warehouse on the east property.

Meeting with ComEd and DuPage County Staff

Staff participated in a remote meeting with ComEd and DuPage County staff last week regarding increasing electricity capacity, primarily to serve the current and future needs of the DuPage Business Center. Of primary concern is the routing for new wires, as Kress Road doesn't have much room outside of the pavement within County ROW. The added infrastructure would start at the ComEd facility at the end of Pilsen Road, adjacent to the Prairie Path. ComEd originally wanted to run the wiring along the Prairie Path, but there apparently a number of logistical and environmental issues associated with that option.

New Grid and Rate Plans - Commonwealth Edison

Last week, ComEd filed integrated grid and rate plans with the Illinois Commerce Commission. These plans are intended to set a forward-looking strategy to combat climate change, enhance grid reliability and resilience, and equitably promote the State's clean energy goals. Developed under the state's Climate and Equitable Jobs Act (CEJA), the plans are stated to align with ComEd's vision for advancing an equitable, low-carbon future, and were shaped by significant stakeholder engagement. To smooth the customer bill impact of the revenue requirement increases included in the plan, ComEd is adopting a phased in approach to defer the effect on rates of a portion of the 2024 revenue requirement until 2026.

Park District staff suggested that it would be nice to have a shelter closer to pickleball/ tennis. So if possible, taking one from the North Area and moving it somewhere nearby the pickleball area. I think it would be utilized much more! Then for the north area, even adding a few benches along the path (what would have been by pickleball).

Weston Solutions' team also reviewed the Draft Park Plan and had the following comments:

1. North Area

- a. The plan proposes native Illinois trees in the North Area. Since most of the North Area is underlain by limestone screenings, growing native trees in this Area may not be optimal. Appropriate experts should be consulted to confirm the same.
- b. Significant stormwater issues associated with the bike path culvert should be addressed as the plan is developed further.

2. Central Core Area

a. The existing WCERT building depicted in the plan will no longer exist once all the work is completed. The associated area can be used for park purposes.

3. South Area

a. In consultation with the City, the entire southern half of the South Area has been designed to serve as a detention area for surface water runoff. The proposed soccer fields may be impacted by this issue. The City should consider implementing alternative stormwater management strategies.

District 94 has expressed concern about losing the parking lot which it leases from the City for its students to use.

Partnership with Ball Horticultural

City staff and Ball reps continue to work together to improve Sesquicentennial Park; the latest plans to install an irrigation system are under review.



Aptim Team:

The City and County did approve the plans from a couple years ago.

Regarding the outfall locations, I am told that this is a complex stormwater project because the design takes into consideration the flood level of the adjacent Creek and used the existing outfall locations rather than sealing them off and installing new ones. The only thing altered was the size of the outfall—it was slightly reduced. This called for more pond volume (due to the slower release rate and the increase in impermeable surface). As the Creek rises, the pond serves not only the LRS property but it captures some of the creek. The creek will use the pond until it the pond fills to the outlet level, at which point the exchange of water stops. The difference between the old lower outlet and the new 100-year flood level equals the added pond volume. While not common, using the old infrastructure in the new design makes sense in terms of cost and when managing the complexities of two adjacent water bodies.

So from the City's and County's perspectives, stormwater management on the site for the proposed waste transfer station is acceptable, and no adjustments need to be made.

Thanks for looking out for the City's best interests during the pre-application reviews.

When I first learned of the proposal to construct another garbage waste transfer station in West Chicago, I was concerned about the negative impact it would have on our communities.

I recently learned that some residents were notified that Lakeshore Recycling Systems would be officially filing its application on October 19th then ended up not following through. Now I'm even more concerned that something is being hidden. Residents of West Chicago, St. Charles, Wayne and Geneva deserve to know what is in the application and why Lakeshore Recycling Systems is stalling.

Our communities will suffer if Lakeshore Recycling Systems is allowed to construct another garbage waste transfer station here. It would mean more litter, increased odors, more traffic resulting in wear and tear on our roads, lowering our property values and hurting our environment.

West Chicago is already the only community in DuPage County with a garbage waste transfer station within its borders. Hi Sean, I hope you and family are doing well during this time. The rate in the Host Agreement is more than the current facility, and more than other waste transfer stations, for which data was gathered/received, but for the City of Batavia. City of Batavia's is higher because that municipality contracts with the operator of the transfer station, Advanced Disposal, for its residential waste hauling contract (like City of West Chicago does with Groot for the current transfer station). If City of West Chicago had contracted with Lakeshore Recycling Systems for its residential waste hauling contract, we would have a superior tipping fee per ton compared to City of Batavia (if the expected application for a waste transfer station is deemed to meet the nine State-defined eligibility criteria). City of West Chicago

chose to continue contracting with Groot last year, instead of Lakeshore Recycling Systems, because it provided substantial savings to our residents, which was deemed more important than any added revenue to the City in the future. Lakeshore will have another opportunity to sharpen its pencil after the five year residential waste hauling contract expires to offer a more competitive proposal.

Hi Mr. Gordon,

I hope you are doing well today. In follow-up to your question, a Host Community Benefit Agreement is a contract between a local government and a waste hauler that has expressed interest in locating a waste transfer station within its jurisdiction. It provides for monetary and non-monetary benefits to a potential host community should some governmental or judicial entity deem that an application for a waste transfer station meets the nine eligibility criteria dictated by State Statute. For example, if a City Council or Village Board determines, after a public hearing, that a submitted application for a waste transfer station **does not** meet the nine eligibility criteria, that decision is appealable first to the Illinois Pollution Control Board or even later to a Circuit Court. Either the Illinois Pollution Control Board or the Court could overturn a City Council's or Village Board's decision. If there were no Host Community Benefit Agreement in place and the final siting decision was granted by a higher authority, no benefits would be received by the host community. This is why this Agreement is negotiated first, prior to an application with all of the facts/data being submitted. That is the case in West Chicago.

Legislation approved by a City Council is required to be signed by the Mayor. The City Council approved the Host Agreement, so the Mayor had to sign it; the Mayor does not vote on this issue (unless to break a tie).

Please note this is a <u>normal</u> process for all local government to receive tipping fees. I voted yes to protect the City economically should some level of government determine that the 9 eligibility criteria are met. Again, No application has been received.

Regarding this issue:

While one is expected, the City has not yet received an application to site a new waste transfer station in West Chicago. If an application is filed, the State required process is that the City hires a hearing officer to preside over a hearing where testimony is taken from experts. This hearing, which usually last several days, will allow for public testimony to be taken, both in person and in writing. The hearing officer then presents a recommendation to the City Council as to whether or not the applicant meets the nine eligibility criteria. If it meets the criteria, the City is required to approve it. If not, the City can deny it. Either way, there is an opportunity for the decision to be appealed to the Illinois Pollution Control Board, and then to the judicial system if desired after that. The City Council simply cannot say it doesn't want a new, or for that matter, another waste transfer station, as the decision has to be tied to the eligibility criteria. Because the City hasn't yet received an application, we have few facts or data to begin to understand what is being requested by Lakeshore Recycling Systems, such as the number of trucks that will be accessing the facility, and so at this time it is unknown if the eligibility criteria will be met. Information will be posted on our website if/once an application is received.

I hope that information is helpful.
