ORDER OF THE BOARD (by B. F. Currie):

On June 24, 2022, the Office of the Attorney General, on behalf of the People of the State of Illinois (People), filed a one-count complaint against Norman Junejo (Junejo). The complaint concerns Junejo's gasoline dispensing facility located at 7700 South Kedzie Avenue, Chicago, Cook County. The complaint alleged Junejo violated Section 9(a) of the Act (415 ILCS 5/9(a) (2022)) and Sections 218.586(i)(1)(B) and 218.586(i)(2)(C) of the Board Air Pollution Regulations (35 Ill. Adm. Code 218.586(i)(1)(B) and 218.586(i)(2)(C)) by causing, threatening, or allowing the discharge or emission of volatile organic compounds into the environment; by failing to timely decommission its vapor collection and control system; and by failing to submit a decommissioning checklist, certification, and test results to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency.

On November 29, 2023, the People filed a motion for voluntary dismissal without prejudice (Mot.). "On September 8, 2023, Respondent provided documents that confirmed Respondent removed all dispensers at the Facility prior to the December 31, 2016, deadline. Therefore, Respondent was not required to decommission any vapor control and collection systems at the Facility." Mot. at 2. Based on these factors, the People request that the Board grant the motion to dismiss the complaint. *Id.* at 2-3, *citing* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.500(a), and 735 ILCS 5/2-1009(a) (2022).

As Junejo removed the dispensers prior to the decommissioning deadline of December 31, 2016 (*see* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 218.586(i)(1)(B)), the Board grants the motion for voluntary dismissal without prejudice, dismisses the People's complaint, and closes the docket.
