ORDER OF THE BOARD (by B.F. Currie):


On May 11, 2023, the Office of the Attorney General, on behalf of the People of the State of Illinois (People), filed a one-count complaint against Shivam Energy Inc. (Shivam). The complaint concerns Shivam’s gasoline dispensing facility located at 399 W. Liberty Street, Wauconda, in Lake County (facility). The Board accepted the complaint for hearing on May 18, 2023.

On September 13, 2023, the People filed a motion for leave to file an amended complaint. The People sought to remove Shivam as respondent and to add Trushar Patel, doing business as Shivam Energy, Inc.; Rajani P. Patel, doing business as Shivam Energy, Inc.; and Jay Patel, an individual, as respondents. On October 5, 2023, the Board granted the People’s unopposed motion for leave, accepted the amended complaint, and directed its Clerk to make corresponding changes in the docket.

On March 29, 2024, the People filed a motion for leave to file a second amended complaint (Mot.). The People seek to remove Trushar Patel and Rajani P. Patel, both doing business as Shivam Energy, Inc. as well as Jay Patel as respondents and to add Jay Shri Ganesha, Inc. doing business as Shivam Energy, Inc. and as Marathon Gas as a respondent. *Id.* at 2. The People report that neither Trushar Patel nor Rajani P. Patel owned or operated the facility during the time period of the violation. *Id.* The People also request to remove Jay Patel as a respondent, but do not report a reason for his removal. No response was filed to the People’s motion. The Board grants the People’s motion for leave to file the Second Amended Complaint, changes the caption to reflect the new respondents, and directs the Clerk to make the corresponding changes to the docket of this case.
