                   To briefly recap, USEPA actions
24
    during the time frame of July 1, 2023 through
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Page 3

- 1 December 31, 2023, USEPA, on October 12, 2023,
- 2 updated the current ozone absorption
- 3 cross-section to the recommended consensus-based
- 4 cross-section value. The new value is 1.2 percent
- 5 lower than the current value and reduces the
- 6 uncertainty in the value.
- 7 Second, on November 6th, 2023,
- 8 USEPA updated its list of designated reference
- 9 and equivalent methods to modify existing method
- 10 designations and designated the new federal
- 11 equivalent method for measuring concentrations of
- 12 particulate matter in ambient air. The Board
- 13 proposes to incorporate this new version of the
- 14 list.
- 15 On March 7, 2024, the Board issued
- 16 the proposed rule change and a proposal for
- 17 public comment. Notice of this hearing was
- 18 published in 11 newspapers in different
- 19 geographical locations throughout the state.
- 20 This began a period of 45 days of public comment.
- 21 The end of this comment period will be May 6th,
- 22 2024. The Board may adopt this proposed change
- 23 at its May 16th board meeting with a possible
- 24 filing and effective date of May 17, 2024 and a
