## ILLINOIS POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD

MINUTES OF REGULAR INFORMAL MEETING, MARCH 1, 1971 189 W. MADISON STREET, CHICAGO

This meeting was principally devoted to preliminary discussion of various pending cases. The Board agreed to take final action on March 3 on the following cases: ## PCB 70-16, 70-18, 70-21, 70-40, 70-41, 70-44 and 54, 70-48 and 51, and the opinion in 71-7; and to take action on proposed final drafts in ##R71-5 (second final draft) and R70-11.

After initial discussion of # 70-33, Greenlee Foundries v. EPA, the Board agreed that more study was required before an opinion could be assigned for preparation, and further discussion was scheduled for the following Monday.

Mr. Kissel reported that the purported settlement received in # 70-35, Juergensmeyer v. Fox Valley Grease Blending Co., was in fact two different settlement proposals by the two parties; that the parties had promised a true settlement agreement by this day; and that the EPA should be asked to investigate whether the new plant site proposed would operate in compliance with the regulations. The Board agreed to await additional word from the parties before taking action.

After preliminary discussion the Board postponed consideration of # 70-46, Glenbrook Labs v. EPA, until the following Monday. Mr. Kissel was asked to prepare a draft opinion.

Mr. Currie distributed copies of the proposed St. Louis area implementation plan for sulfur and particulates, asking that the Board on March 3 vote on whether or not to authorize a hearing.

Mr. Currie stated that in his view the Board had no authority to entertain the petition to ban nonreturnable bottles, #R71-7, and that the Board should vote on the issue March 3.

Mr. Aldrich asked that Mr. Leitner be heard in R70-8 as to measurement techniques, and noted that it might be advisable to hold a final hearing, perhaps in the Springfield area, after the Board reviews the transcripts, in order to fill any gaps in the record.

Conclusion of the meeting was postponed until Tuesday, March 2, at which time the Board conducted a brief further discussion of opinions prepared by Mr. Kissel and by Mr. Dumelle in #70-21.
