## ILLINOIS POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD

MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING APRIL 17, 1972 - 309 West Washington Street, Chicago, Illinois

All Board Members except Mr. Dumelle were present.

The following opinions and orders were adopted by the Board by a vote of 4-0: South Palos Township, PCB 72-8, was ordered to abate pollution by completing its sanitary sewage system; and Park Manor Town House Apartments, PCB 72-28, was granted a variance for one year from the Pollution Control Board Regulations regarding the filing and approval of a schedule for completing improvements to meet the advanced treatment requirements of Rule 404(c) and (f), with certain conditions.

Decisions in Kammerer Concrete, PCB 72-31, and Robert Nilles, PCB 72-97, were postponed until April 25, 1972.

After discussion, Mr. Currie said he would ask Mr. Dumelle to prepare an opinion granting the requested variance in Commonwealth Edison Company and Iowa-Illinois Gas & Electric Company (Quad Cities Permit), PCB 71-20, from the Mississippi River Thermal Standards for the period from April 20 until the diffuser discharge is completed on about August 15, 1972; the Board will pass on this case on April 25, 1972.

Discussion was postponed until April 25, in the following cases: General Electric Company, PCB 71-238; Commonwealth Edison Company Application for Permits for Zion Units 1 and 2, PCB 71-238; Commonwealth Edison Company Application for Permit for LaSalle County Station Units 1 and 2, PCB 71-354.

Mr. Lawton agreed to prepare an opinion finding a threat of water pollution and assessing a penalty in Ayrshire Coal Company et al, PCB 71-323, an enforcement action alleging that the companies have caused water pollution at their strip coal mine near Marion. In Zaborac Electric, Inc., PCB 72-66, dealing with open burning in Peoria County, Mr. Currie said he would ask Mr. Dumelle to prepare an opinion and order imposing a small penalty. Both cases were set for decision April 25.

Godfrey Township, PCB 72-68, was consolidated with Robert W. Graham, PCB 72-154, and a hearing was authorized. Citizens Utilities, PCB 72-69, was dismissed by a vote of 4-0, and Mr. Kissel will prepare the order.

Minutes for March 28, 1972 were adopted by a vote of 4-0.

A hearing was authorized in Salt Creek Drainage Basin Sanitary District, PCB 72-134, and hearings are mandatory in the following new cases: Harshany, Inc. et al, PCB 72-151; EPA v. The Flintkote Co., PCB 72-152; EPA v. Consolidation Coal Co., PCB 72-153; and EPA v. Illinois Central Railroad Co., PCB 72-155.

Mr. Currie noted that an order by the Appellate Court has been received reversing and remanding the Board order of March 28, 1972 dismissing the petitions in the following cases: Glen Oak Cemetery Co., PCB 72-117; Forest Home Cemetery Co., PCB 72-118; Cedar Park Cemetery Association, PCB 72-119; and Oakridge Cemetery (Hillside), Inc., PCB 72-120. The Attorney General was asked to file a Motion and Petition for Rehearing in these cases.
