MINUTES OF REGULAR FORMAL BOARD MEETING
DECEMBER 21, 1971, Oak Park Library, Oak Park, Illinois

Mr. Dumelle was absent due to illness.

The following opinions and orders were adopted by the Board; ##71-28, E. P. A. v. Danville Sanitary District, motion to amend original order and allow additional 500 dwelling units to connect to sewer system denied, 4-0 vote; 71-211, Agrico Chemicals Co., variance granted to emit particulate air contaminants subject to conditions, 4-0 vote; 71-237, E. P. A. v. George Reeves, motion to modify order granted and request to publish vote agreed to, 4-0 vote; 71-250, Witco Chemical Corporation, variance granted to emit particulate contaminants subject to certain conditions, 4-0 vote; 71-261, 71-262, 71-263, 71-264, CIPCO, variances granted to emit particulate matter, bond posted and reports shall be filed, 4-0 vote; 71-286, John T. LaForge Co., petition dismissed and declared "essentially moot" since December 8, 1971 compliance date had passed, 4-0 vote; 71-287, Village of Sauget, variance granted to extend deadline for construction of secondary treatment facilities subject to certain conditions, 4-0 vote; 71-295 City of Lincoln, 4-0 vote; 71-296, Marquette Cement, variance extended for one year from Board original order (#71-23) and conditions of original order to remain in effect, 4-0 vote; 71-298, E. P. A. City of Waukegan et al, Waukegan ordered to pay penalty of \$1,000 for operation of a refuse disposal site without a permit and violating refuse disposal site regulations, Tewes and T-K Diposal ordered to pay penalty of \$250 each for dumping of refuse without being certain that site was authorized, 4-0 vote; 71-312, Custom Farm Services, cease and desist from violations of SWB-14 and Environmental Protection Act, post bond and pay penalties, \$162.34 for fish kill and \$2,000 to State of Illinois, 4-0 vote; 71-313, Lake County School District, petition for connection to North Shore Sanitary District granted, 4-0 vote; 71-314, Waukegan Park District, petition for connection to North Shore Sanitary District granted, 4-0 vote; 71-342 and 71-382 dismissed as moot (supplementary statement to 71-313 and 71-314); 71-321, Central Christian Church, petition dismissed as inadequate, 4-0 vote; 71-315, Everett McClelland, variance from refuse disposal rules and regulations denied, 4-0 vote; 71-363, Vance T. Venable, variance granted for connection in North Shore Sanitary District, 4-0 vote.

Mr. Currie discussed the Proposed Sewer Connection Bans, R71-19 and the Proposal was authorized for publication, 4-0 vote.

The Proposed Final Draft of Water Quality Standards Revisions, R71-14 was authorized for publication, 4-0 vote.

New cases: #71-384, Village of Lena, hold for E. P. A. recommendation; 71-385, E. P. A. v. Ladd Construction Co., hearing is mandatory.

Questions and general comments from the public followed on various topics, disposable containers, septic tanks, re-opening of cases and zoning ordinances in regard to sewer hook-ups.
