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MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING FEBRUARY 22, 1990 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

All Board Members were present. After calling the meeting to order, Chairman Marlin introduced the following new staff members: Marie Tipsord, who comes to the Board from JCAR, will be assigned to the Board's Federal Unit and Deborah Stonich, who comes to the Board from the Environmental Protection Agency, will serve as Board Member J. Anderson's Assistant.

In R87-36, Modine Site-Specific, a Proposed Rule, Second Notice, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (RF)

In R88-25, City of Havana CSO, a Proposed Rule, Second Notice, Proposed Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (MN)

In R89-20, Pretreatment Regulations Corrections, an Order closing the docket was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JA)

Default Orders were adopted in these Administrative Citations: ##89-305, Edward and Janet Jones; 90-1, Wayne Carter; 90-2, Harris Equipment Corporation; 90-3, Bud Ingledue; 90-4, Bob Carnahan; 90-5, Daniel Wiegel; 90-6, Wilbur Clair; 90-7, Roger Smith; 90-9, John Donovan; 90-10, Everett Allen; 90-11, Gordon Lee; 90-12, John Donovan; 90-13, Anthony Jones.

Agency motion to withdraw the complaint and dismiss the action was granted without prejudice in #AC 89-198, General Iron Industries, by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

Agency motion to vacate a January 11, 1990 Default Order and withdraw the complaint was granted in #AC 89-266, Darco, Inc., by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

Respondent's motion to reconsider and vacate a January 25, 1990 Default Order was denied in #AC 89-276, Rockford Speedway, by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

By a vote of 7-0, an Agency motion to amend the complaint on its face instanter was granted in $\#AC \ 89-306$, Walter Rockamann, and unless the Respondent moves to dismiss its Petition for Review and remits the civil penalty, the matter will proceed to hearing. (JM)

An Order closing the dockets and relinquishing jurisdiction to the authority vested in the Abandoned Mined Lands Reclamation Council under the Abandoned Mined Lands and Water Reclamation Act, was adopted in ##72-63, -153, Truax-Traer Coal Company and Consolidation Coal Company, by a vote of 7-0. (JM) Petitioner's motion for dismissal was granted in #88-149, Cablec Corporation, by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

An Order accepting the name substitution (from Gallagher Blacktop to Gallagher Asphalt) unless objected to by the Complainant, and granting Respondent's motion for an extension of time to April 30, 1990, to comply with a January 11, 1990 Interim Opinion and Order was adopted in #89-64, Gallagher Asphalt, by a vote of 6-1. J. Theodore Meyer dissented. (BF)

Petitioner's motion to withdraw as counsel filed by Gardner, Carton and Douglas was granted in #89-72, Olin Corporation, by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

Agency motion to amend the complaint to correct a misnomer contained in the original complaint was granted in #89-190, Ravenswood Hospital, by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

An Order dismissing the proceedings in #89-202, Laclede Steel, was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

Petitioner's motion to dismiss was granted in #90-1, Central Illinois Public Service, by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

Petitioner's motion for summary judgment was denied and an Agency motion for leave to file its permit record instanter was granted in #90-8, City of Metropolis, by a vote of 7-0. (JTM)

An Order was adopted pursuant to the Stepan Company's motion to strike and motion for application of Section 28 rulemaking procedures in R89-16, RACT Deficiencies, by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

These cases were discussed and held to March 8, 1990 for further discussion or possible decision: ##88-151, Citizens Utilities; 89-107, City of Geneva.

An Order advising the Petitioner that the Board will dismiss the proceedings in #89-129, National Environmental Services, at its March 8, 1990 Board meeting unless the Petitioner files certain documents by March 6, 1990, was adopted by a vote of 6-1. J. Theodore Meyer dissented. (BF)

These regulatory matters were discussed and held to March 8, 1990 for further discussion or possible decision: R87-34, East Moline Site-Specific; R89-9, RCRA Update, USEPA Regulations (January 1, 1989 through June 30, 1989); R89-16, RACT Deficiencies.

In new cases these actions were taken by a vote of 7-0: ##90-17, People of the State of Illinois v. United States Department of the Navy, hearing mandatory; 90-23, Village of Mundelein v. EPA, held for Agency Recommendation; 90-24, Rock-Ola Manufacturing Corporation v. EPA, accepted for hearing, Order by B. Forcade; 90-25, City of Charleston v. EPA, provisional variance granted, Order by J. Marlin.

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An Order accepting the petition and directing the Petitioner, if it has not already done so, to comply with the publication of notice requirement set forth in 35 Ill. Adm. Code 106.711, and directing the Agency to file a response to the petition in accordance with 35 Ill. Adm. Code 106.714, was adopted in AS 90-1, Petition of the City of Jacksonville, by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

Minutes of the February 8 and February 15, 1990 Board Meetings were approved by a vote of 7-0.

By a vote of 7-0, the Board approved a meeting schedule for FY 91 which will be announced in the Board's Environmental Register.

The Board will hold a special Board Meeting on Thursday, March 1, 1990 at 2:00 p.m. in the Board's conference room to consider the following matters: R88-7, Landfill Regulations, Proposed Rule, Second First Notice, Opinion and Order; R89-10, UST Update, USEPA Regulations (October 27, 1988 through June 30, 1989), Adopted Rule, Final Order. The Clerk will post a notice.

All other matters not disposed of as listed were ordered held to March 8, 1990 for possible consideration.
