MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING MAY 10, 1990 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

All Board Members were present.

Board Member B. Forcade presented a draft Opinion and Order in #88-71, Allen Barry. After a very extensive discussion regarding the legal aspects of the penalty by J. Anderson, the Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. J. Anderson concurred. (BF)

Chairman Marlin presented a draft Opinion and Order in #AC 89-18, J & R Landfill. Motion to reaffirm the votes recorded on the individual Counts in this matter at the Board's April 26, 1990 meeting by J. Theodore Meyer was granted by a vote of 7-0. An Order was then adopted by a vote of 4-3 with respect to Count A, a vote of 4-3 with respect to Count B, a vote of 7-0 with respect to Count C, and a vote of 4-3 with respect to Count D. (JM)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #89-162, Family Enterprises, by a vote of 7-0. (MN)

An Interim Opinion and Order was adopted in #89-170, Centralia Environmental Services, by a vote of 7-0. (MN)

In R88-5(B), Procedural Rules (Parts 102 and 106; Subparts D, E, and F), an Adopted Rule, Final Order, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JTM)

In R88-14, Pharmaceutical Manufacturing Plant, a Proposed Rule, Second First Notice, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

In R88-25, City of Havana, an Adopted Rule, Final Order, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (MN)

In R89-16(A), RACT Deficiencies, an Adopted Rule, Final Order, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

By a vote of 7-0, a Default Order was adopted in this Administrative Citation: #90-22, Waste Management. (Since J. Theodore Meyer's return to the meeting, after a ten minute break was delayed, the meeting resumed with the discussion portion of the Agenda)

EPA, accepted for hearing and Board notes that this proceeding seems to present primarily an issue of law regarding whether Section 215.245 is stayed during any appellate court review, and as such, it may be appropriate for either party to file a motion for summary judgment, with legal briefs, to dispose of some or all of the issues in this matter, Order by B. Forcade; 90-87, People of the State of Illinois v. Jernberg Industries, Inc., hearing mandatory; 90-88, People of the State of Illinois v. Eldon Swedberg, d/b/a Eldon Swedberg Swine Farm, hearing mandatory; 90-89, EPA v. Fred Johnson, Herman Loeb and Johnson and Briggs Tank Truck Service, a/k/a Johnson and Briggs Tank Truck and Heater Service, hearing mandatory; 90-91, People of the State of Illinois v. General Electric Corporation, hearing mandatory; 90-92, People of the State of Illinois v. Lennon Wallpaper Company, hearing mandatory; 90-93, People of the State of Illinois v. Magnaflux Corporation, hearing mandatory; 90-94, Horace File et al. v. D & L Landfill, Inc. and Bond County Board of Supervisors, accepted for hearing, Order by B. Forcade; 90-95, ESG Watts, Inc. v. By a vote of 7-0, Complainant's motion for withdrawal of violations 2 and 4 alleged in Administrative Citation #90-25, Robert Ellis, was granted and unless already paid, the Respondent was ordered to pay, within 30 days of the entry of this Order, a civil penalty of \$1,000.00 for the remaining two (2) violations. (JM)

By a vote of 7-0, the Board reconsidered and reaffirmed its April 12, 1990 Order to treat Petitioner's request for extension of variance as a motion for extension of variance in #88-69, Scott Air Force Base. J. Dumelle concurred. (BF)

By a vote of 7-0, an Order was adopted pursuant to Petitioner's motions for extension of variance in #88-69, Scott Air Force Base. J. Dumelle concurred. (JA)

By a vote of 5-2, Agency motion for extension of time to respond to Petitioner's motion for reconsideration was granted until May 18, 1990 in #88-151, Citizens Utilities. Messrs. R. Flemal and

J. Theodore Meyer dissented. (JA)

By a vote of 7-0, Respondent's motion for hearing in #89-64, Gallagher Asphalt, was granted and the Board reiterated its specific intention that the noise violations already found shall not continue for another construction season through the summer of 1990. J. Marlin concurred. (BF)

By a vote of 7-0, an Order was adopted pursuant to Respondent's motion to exclude certain evidence admitted at hearing in #89-182, Robert & Alice Kvatsak. (BF)

Petitioner's motion to file response to Agency Recommendation Instanter was granted in #89-183, City of Batavia, by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

Petitioner's motion for reconsideration or in the alternative for leave to file an Interlocutory Appeal was denied in #89-184, The Grigoleit Company, by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

Petitioner's motion to withdraw appeal was granted in #90-35, Pollution Control Industries, by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

Petitioner's motion to dismiss permit appeal was granted in #90-36, H & L Disposal Company, by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

By a vote of 7-0, an Order was adopted pursuant to Petitioner's motion to withdraw its appeal in #90-40, Waste Management. (BF)

By a vote of 7-0, an Order was adopted pursuant to Petitioner's motion to supplement its petition for variance in #90-45, Minnesota Mining and Manufacturing Company. (RF)

Petitioner's motion for reconsideration of a March 8, 1990 Opinion and Order was denied in R87-35, City of East Moline Site-Specific, by a vote of 7-0. (JA)

By a vote of 7-0, an Order was adopted pursuant to Petitioner's motion for reconsideration of a March 8, 1990 Opinion and Order and motion to substitute Affidavit of James A. Huff in R87-35, City of East Moline Site-Specific. (JA)(Thereafter the Board gave leave to J. Theodore Meyer to join with the majority on votes taken in New Cases during his absence from the meeting and the Orders adopted in his absence will reflect 7-0 votes)

Minutes of the April 26 and May 2, 1990 Board Meetings were approved by a vote of 7-0.

Chairman Marlin presented a draft Order in #88-199, Seegers Grain. Motion to accept the Stipulation and dismiss the proceedings by J. Theodore Meyer and seconded by J. Dumelle failed by a 3-4 vote with J. Dumelle, J. Theodore Meyer and M.

Nardulli for it and J. Anderson, B. Forcade, R. Flemal and J. Marlin against it. Motion by J. Anderson to deny Respondent's motion and set the matter for hearing failed to carry. Motion to grant Respondent's motion to defer decisionmaking for 30 days by J. Marlin and seconded by B. Forcade carried by a vote of 6-1 with J. Dumelle, B. Forcade, R. Flemal, J. Marlin, J. Theodore Meyer and, M. Nardulli for it and J. Anderson against it. An Order, remanding the matter to the Hearing Officer with directions to schedule a settlement conference within 14 days and schedule a hearing should efforts at settlement fail, was then adopted by a vote of 6-1 J. Anderson dissented and J. Theodore Meyer concurred. (JM)

All other matters not disposed of as listed were ordered held to May 24, 1990 for possible consideration.
