MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING MAY 11, 1989 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

All Board Members were present.

An Opinion and Order was adopted in \$87-171, Archer Daniels Midland, by a vote of 7-0. (RF)

An Interim Order was adopted in \$88-201, City of Marion, by a vote of 7-0. (JA)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #89-14, Village of Montgomery, by a vote of 5-2. Messrs. J. Dumelle and B. Forcade dissented. (JM)

In R87-2, Marathon Petroleum, a Proposed Rule, First Notice, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

In R87-6, Phosphorus Effluent Standards, a Proposed Rule, Second First Notice, Proposed Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. J. Dumelle concurred. (JA)

In R88-22, Ammonia Water Standards, an Adopted Rule, Final Order, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (RF)

In R89-3, Pretreatment Regulations (July 1, 1988 through December 31, 1988), a Proposal for Public Comment, Proposed Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

Orders were adopted in these Administrative Citations by a vote of 7-0: ##89-61, B.J. Smith; 89-62, Irene McDonald; 89-64, W.W. Sanitation; 89-65, American Grading; 89-66, City of Casey.

Respondent's motion to dismiss for lack of jurisdiction was denied in #AC 89-18, J&R Landfill, by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

Agency motion to vacate an April 6, 1989 default Order and to dismiss the proceedings was granted in #AC 89-38, ESG Watts, by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

Agency motions for entry of a final Order and for leave to file a reply to Respondent's response to Complainant's motion for entry of a final Order will be taken with the case in chief.

A joint request to modify a February 2, 1989 Board Order was granted in #88-14, Minnesota Mining, by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

Respondent's motion to correct transcript was granted in #88-127, Koppers Company, by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

A request by the Association of Concerned Environmentalists to

declare the April 20, 1989 hearing invalid and to request another hearing was granted in part and denied in part in #88-172, Allied-Signal, by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

Petitioner's motion to dismiss the petition in #88-202, AT&T Information Systems, was granted by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

Petitioner's motion to dismiss was granted in \$89-6, Rockford Products, by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

Petitioner's motion for admission of a Lake County Study in #89-15, A.R.F. Landfill, will be taken with the case in chief.

Agency motion for an extension of time to file its Recommendation was granted until May 31, 1989 in #89-58, Minnesota Mining, by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

Since objections were filed a hearing will be set in #89-63, John Metropoulos, after the amended petition is filed with the Board.

In R88-24, Managing Scrap Tire Accumulations for the Control of Mosquitoes, Part 849, an Order correcting a typographical error contained in an April 27, 1989 Adopted Rule Final Order and directing the Clerk to send corrected copies of page 30 to persons on the notice list, was adopted by a vote of 7-0. Theodore Meyer; 89-80, City of Byron v. EPA, provisional variance granted, Opinion and Order by J. Marlin; 89-81, American Nickeloid Company v. EPA, provisional variance granted, Order by J. Marlin; 89-82, Interlake v. EPA, provisional variance granted, Order by J. Marlin; R89-6, Elizabeth Street Foundry, Inc., Petition for a Site-Specific Rule Change, additional information requested, Order by J. Dumelle; R89-7, Continuous Monitoring Rules and Repeal of New Source Performance Standards and Hazardous Air Pollutant Regulations, Proposed Rule, First Notice, Opinion and Order by J. Dumelle.

By a vote of 7-0, Respondent's petition for dismissal of the Administrative Citation in #AC 89-67, Merle Buerkett, was construed by the Board to be a Petition for Review and a hearing will be set. (JM)
