MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING NOVEMBER 15, 1989 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

All Board Members were present.

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #87-93, Commonwealth Edison, by a vote of 7-0. J. Marlin concurred. (RF)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #88-36, Mervis Industries, by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

Board Member J. Theodore Meyer presented a draft Opinion and Order in #89-108, McLean County Disposal. An amendment by J. Anderson was accepted and an amended Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. B. Forcade concurred. (JTM)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #89-122, Rowe Foundry and Machine, by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

In R89-1, RCRA Update (July 1, 1989 through December 31, 1989), a corrective Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JA)

In R89-7(A), Continuous Monitoring Rules, an Adopted Rule, Final Order, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

In R89-10, UST Update (October 27, 1988 through June 30, 1989), a Proposal for Public Comment, Proposed Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JA)
