MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING APRIL 6, 1989 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

All Board Members were present.

A Supplemental Opinion and Order was adopted in #86-27, Modine Manufacturing, by a vote of 6-1. R. Flemal dissented. (JA)

Board Member J. Dumelle presented a draft Opinion and Order in #86-47, Fedders-USA. Alternative language offered by J. Anderson and seconded by J. Marlin failed to carry by a vote of 2-5 with J. Anderson and J. Marlin for it and J. Dumelle, B. Forcade, R. Flemal, J. Theodore Meyer and M. Nardulli against it. The Opinion and Order was then adopted by a vote of 7-0. J. Anderson concurred. (JD)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in \$88-117, BFGoodrich Company, by a vote of 7-0. (JTM)

Board Member R. Flemal presented a draft Opinion and Order in #88-190, Waste Management. A motion to amend the draft Order to not uphold the Lake County Board upon Criterion #1 by J. Anderson and seconded by J. Marlin failed to carry by a vote of 3-4 with J. Anderson, J. Marlin and J. Theodore Meyer for it and J. Dumelle, R. Flemal, B. Forcade and M. Nardulli against it. The Opinion and Order was then adopted by a vote of 7-0. J. Anderson, J. Marlin and J. Theodore Meyer concurred. (RF)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #88-204, Village of Elburn, by a vote of 5-2. Messrs. J. Dumelle and B. Forcade dissented. (JM)

In R88-1, Omnibus Rulemaking, an Adopted Rule, Final Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (RF)

In R88-6, City of Mendota CSO, an Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (MN)

In R89-4, UST Financial Assurance Regulations (October 26, 1988), A Proposal for Public Comment, Proposed Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JA)

Orders were adopted in these Administrative Citations by a vote of 7-0: ##89-34, Wayne Fisher; 89-35, Thomas Alexander; 89-37, City of Dixon; 89-38, ESG Watts, Inc.; 89-39, Clinton Landfill.

Agency motion to withdraw the complaint was granted in #AC 89-11, Lefton Iron and Metal, by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

Agency motion to withdraw the complaint was granted in #AC 89-36, City of Chicago Heights, by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

By a vote of 7-0, Respondent's motion for an extension of time to file a petition for review was construed by the Board as a petition for review and a hearing will be set in #AC 89-52, City of Assumption. (JTM)

Agency motion to dismiss was granted in #AC 89-63, ESG Watts, by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

By a vote of 7-0, Respondent's motion to vacate a March 9, 1989 Board Order was granted and the amended Stipulation and Proposal for Settlement filed April 3, 1989 was accepted in #84-92, Richard Krohn. (JD)

A joint motion to continue hearing to allow for implementation of a settlement agreement was denied in #87-183, Container Corporation, by a vote of 7-0. (JA)

By a vote of 7-0, Petitioner's motion for reconsideration of a February 2, 1989 Board Order was granted and upon reconsideration the parties were ordered to file memoranda, no later than May 5, 1989, which provides specific language that would be added to or deleted from the February 2 Order to implement the agreement of the parties in #88-14, Minnesota Mining. (BF)

By a vote of 7-0, an Order advising the parties that unless a formal response is received by April 17, 1989, regarding the status of one of several volumes of the Agency record entitled "Exhibit J: Confidential Documents", the docket in #88-178, Indian Refining Company, will be dismissed. (JA)

Agency motion to file Instanter its Recommendation in #88-196, Koppers Industries, was granted by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

Complainant's motion for voluntary dismissal was granted in #89-4, Elmhurst-Chicago Stone, by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

Agency motion to file Instanter its Recommendation in #89-25, Can-Am Industries, was granted by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

Agency motion for clarification of a February 2, 1989 Opinion was denied and Petitioner's motion to file Instanter its response to the Agency's motion for clarification was granted in R85-11, Illinois-American, by a vote of 7-0. (JTM)
