MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING February 22, 1984 Chicago, Illinois

All Board Members were present.

An Order was adopted in #82-55, Waste Management which addressed the proposed Settlement Agreement, remanded to the Board, by the Supreme Court. The Stipulation and Proposal for Settlement was rejected by a vote of 7-0. Board Members, Dumelle, Forcade and Marlin concurred. Mrs. Anderson will prepare the Order.

An Opinion only was adopted in #83-106, American National Bank, by a vote of 5-2, Mr. Meyer and Mr. Nega dissented.

Opinions and Orders were adopted in these cases by a vote of 7-0: ##83-157, Lamplighter; 83-225, Beardstown.

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #83-173, Industrial Salvage, by a vote of 6-1, Mr. Meyer dissented.

An Opinion in support of a Proposed Rule, First Notice, Order was adopted for R83-19, Lockport, by a vote of 7-0.

In ##83-228,-229 and 230, St. Charles et al. v. Kane County et al., a motion to quash Subpoena was denied and motion to admit evidence ordered taken with the case by a vote of 6-0, Mr. Forcade abstained. Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.

An Interim Order was adopted in #81-132, Borden by a vote of 4-2. Mr. Forcade abstained and Mr. Anderson and Mr. Dumelle dissented.

In new cases these actions were taken by a vote of 7-0: ##84-16 and 84-20, Metropolitan Sanitary District, hearings authorized, Orders by Mr. Dumelle; 84-17, Wyoming, additional information requested, Order by Mr. Forcade; 84-18, Abex Corporation, dismissed, Order by Mrs. Anderson; 84-19, Midwest Solvents, hearing authorized, additional information requested and previous petition docketed as #84-9 dismissed, Order by Mrs. Anderson; 84-21, EPA v. Ward Crop Service, hearing mandatory; 84-22, Illinois Department of Transportation, Highland Park, Chairman authorized to sign and prepare an Order.

A Resolution and Order was adopted in R84-6, New Source Performance Standards by a vote of 7-0. Mr. Dumelle will prepare it.

The Board decided to hold a special meeting on February 29, 1984 at 10:30 a.m. in order to consider these matters: #83-167, Watts Trucking; R81-25, Chlorinated Solvents; R84-1, Permit and Inspection Fees; and R84-5, Illinois Contingency Plan. A notice will be posted.
