MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING

May 3, 1984

All Board Members were present

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #83-116, Meyer Steel Drum by a vote of 6-0.

In #83-117, Meyer Steel Drum, Mrs. Anderson proposed amendments to the Proposed Opinion and Order prepared by Mr. Forcade. The Amendments were accepted by a vote of 5-1. Mr. Forcade dissented. Mrs. Anderson will prepare the final Opinion and Order which was adopted by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Forcade concurred.

Opinions and Orders were adopted in these matters by a vote of 6-0: #83-133, Van Leer Containers, Mr. Forcade concurred; 84-10, Orchard Hill; R82-14, RACT III, Agricultural Products, Proposed Rule, Second Notice, Order only.

In #82-108, Chrysler, a request for revocation was granted by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.

Petition for rehearing in #83-106, American National Bank, was denied by a vote of 4-2. Mr. Meyer and Mr. Nega dissented. Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.

In #84-26, OMC, application for non-disclosure was denied and referred to the Trade Secret Procedures. Motion for extension of time to respond was granted. The vote was 6-0. Mrs. Anderson will prepare an Order.

Motions to extend time for filing the records in ##84-38, -39, Cabot, were granted by a vote of 6-0. Mrs. Anderson will prepare an Order.

Motions for leave to file answers in ##84-44, U.S. Industrial Chemical and 84-45, Waste Management, were granted by votes of 6-0. Mr. Dumelle will prepare Orders.

These cases were discussed and held to May 18, 1984 meeting for possible decision: ##81-11, Lake County Grading; 82-111, Modine; 83-119, Allied Hastings; 83-161, City of Herrin.

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #83-238, Chicago Roto-Print, by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Forcade concurred.

An Interim Order was adopted in ##84-3, -4, City of Galva, by a vote of 5-0. Mrs. Anderson abstained.

An Amended Petition filed in #84-33, Commonwealth Edison, was Ordered held for an Agency Recommendation.

These regulatory matters were discussed and held to May 18, 1984 for further discussion or possible decision: R82-1, Particulate Emission; R83-6(A), Mine Waste; R84-1 and R84-7, Permit and Inspection Fees; R84-10, RCRA Procedural Rules.

Minutes of Board Meetings held April 19 and 27, 1984 were approved as amended by a vote of 6-0.

The Board then voted 6-0 to reschedule the regular meeting set for May 31, 1984 to May 29, 1984 and asked the Clerk to circulate and post notice.

In new cases these actions were taken by a vote of 6-0: ##84-50, Engineered Coated Products, additional information requested, Order by Mr. Meyer; 84-51, Southern California Chemical, held for an Agency Recommendation; 84-52, EPA v. City of Herrin, hearing mandatory; 84-53, Village Grove Farmers Elevator, hearing authorized and information requested at hearing, Order by Mr. Forcade; 84-54, People v. Fritz Enterprises, hearing mandatory; 84-55, Illinois Power v. EPA, hearing authorized; 84-56, Taracorp, hearing authorized and petitioner asked to file variance separately under docket #84-58, Order by Mr. Dumelle; 84-57, City of Keithsburg, Additional information requested. Order by Mr. Dumelle.

In new regulatory matters the Board took these actions by a vote of 6-0: R84-12, Trihalomethanes Drinking Water Standard, Proposed Inquiry hearings authorized, Order by Mr. Dumelle; R84-13, Union Oil WQS Amendments, authorized for hearing and publication, Motion to waive filing of ten sets of exhibits granted; R84-14, -15, New Source Performance Standards, Resolutions and Orders will be prepared as adopted by Mr. Dumelle; R84-16, Mobile Oil WQS Amendments, authorized for hearing and 200 signature requirement waived.

All matters not disposed of as listed were Ordered held for possible consideration on May 18, 1984.
