May 18, 1984 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

All Board Members were present.

Opinions and Orders were adopted in these cases by a vote of 6-0:

A Proposed Rule, Second Notice Amended Opinion and Order were
adopted in R83-6 (A) by a vote of 6-0.

A Proposed Rule, Second Notice Opinion, was adopted in R84-7,
Permit and Inspection Fees, Permanent Rule, by a vote of 6-0.
