MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING July 19, 1984 Chicago, Illinois

All Board Members were present

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Opinions and Orders were adopted in these cases by a vote of 6-0: ##79-87, Sauget; 83-107, Quaker, Mr. Dumelle concurred; 84-30, Jefferson Electric, Mr. Forcade concurred; 84-53, Villa Grove, Mr. Dumelle concurred.

A Supplemental Opinion was adopted in 83-147, Village of Lombard by a vote of 5-1. Mr. Dumelle concurred and Mr. Forcade dissented.

A Proposed Rule, First Notice, Proposed Opinion and Order was adopted in R82-1, Particulate Emission Limitations Rule 203(g)(1) and 202(b) of Chapter 2, by a vote of 6-0.

A Final Opinion for the emergency rules in R83-28A, Definition of Liquid Hazardous Waste, and a Proposed Opinion for the First Notice proposal in R83-28B, Definition of Liquid Hazardous Waste (Temporary and Permanent Rules), was adopted by a vote of 6-0.

An Order was adopted in R83-28A, Definition of Liquid Hazardous Waste (Emergency Rules) by a vote of 6-0. The motion for clarification and reconsideration, the motion for stay and the motion to present oral argument filed by CBE, were denied.

An Interim Order was adopted in R83-37, Proposed Contingent Penalty Procedural Rule, by a vote of 6-0.

A Proposed Rule, First Notice, Order was adopted in R84-22, Financial Assurance for Closure and Post-Closure Care of Waste Disposal Sites, by a vote of 6-0.

Motion to postpone the hearing in # 82-144, EPA v. City of Galena, was granted by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Forcade will prepare an Order.

Due to an administrative oversight, the Board on its own motion, extended the Board Ordered hearing dates in its Order of June 29, 1984 in #83-9, City of Mt. Olive. The vote was 6-0. Mrs. Anderson will prepare an Order.

Motion for voluntary dismissal was granted in #84-20, Metropolitan Sanitary District, by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.

Motion for modification was denied in #84-26, OMC, by a vote of 6-0. Mrs. Anderson will prepare an Order.

Motion for interlocutory appeal was granted and the motion for stay was denied as moot in #84-44, U.S. Industrial Chemicals

Motion to file Agency record instanter was granted in #84-67, Midwest Rubber Reclaiming Company, by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.

Motion to dismiss was denied in #84-81, Reliable-Nesco, Inc., by a vote of 6-0. Mrs. Anderson will prepare an Order.

A Supplemental Statement was adopted in #84-75, Illinois Power Company, by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Dumelle will prepare it.
