MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING  
September 6, 1984 Chicago, Illinois

All Board Members were present.

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #82-154, City of Moline by a vote of 5-1. Mr. Nega concurred and Mr. Dumelle dissented.

An Order was adopted in #83-9, City of Mt. Olive by a vote of 6-0.

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #83-168, National Can by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Forcade concurred.

An Adopted Rule, Final Opinion and Final Order was adopted in R83-35, Wagner Castings by a vote of 6-0.

No action was taken by the Board on the motion for expedited consideration in #81-155, Bledsoe.

An Interim Order was adopted by a vote of 6-0 in #83-18, Modine.

Motion for reconsideration in #83-147, Lombard, was denied by a vote of 6-0. Mrs. Anderson will prepare an Order.

Motion for reconsideration in #83-173, Industrial Salvage, was granted by a vote of 5-1. Mr. Meyer concurred and Mrs. Anderson dissented. Mr. Forcade will prepare an Order.

By a vote of 6-0, the motion to supplement record was denied and the supplementary information was accepted as an amended petition in #84-37, Mobil Oil. Mr. Marlin will prepare an Order.

Motion to dismiss was granted by a vote of 6-0 in #84-55, Illinois Power. Mr. Meyer will prepare an Order.

Motion to withdraw was granted by a vote of 6-0 in #84-59, O'Fallon. Mr. Meyer will prepare an Order.

Motion to order the Agency to answer interrogatories was denied by a vote of 6-0 in R84-17, Permit Requirements and Operating Standards for Owners and Operators of Class I and Class II Landfills, and for Generators and Haulers of Special Waste. Mrs. Anderson will prepare an Order.

These matters were discussed and held to September 20, 1984 for possible consideration: ##83-2, Chemetco; 83-4, East Moline; 84-51, Southern California Chemical; 84-69, Olin Corporation; R84-10, RCRA and UIC Procedural Rules.
