An Opinion and Order was adopted in #92-142, Illinois Power Company (Clinton Power Station), by a vote of 6-0. (GTG)

An Order finding that the Complainant's affidavit of hearing costs improperly seeks reimbursement for attorney fees and for expert witness fees for testifying, and directing the Complainant to submit a new affidavit of hearing costs within 30 days, which affidavit should specify costs consistent with this Order, was

adopted in #AC 92-79 (Docket B), Lee Hsueh, by a vote of 6-0.
(BF)

An Order denying Respondent's motion for reconsideration of the Board's July 1, 1993 Order and modifying the July 1, 1993 Order to allow payment of the \$1,000.00 penalty within 30 days, and directing the parties to abide by the Board's May 20, 1993 Default Order, was adopted in #AC 93-12, Dave & Earle Phillips, by a vote of 6-0. (CAM)

Agency motion to withdraw the Administrative Citation was granted in #AC 93-27, Oliver A. Smith, by a vote of 6-0. (BF)

Agency motion to withdraw the Administrative Citation was granted in #AC 93-33, Glenn Schriener, by a vote of 6-0. (CAM)

Petitioner's motion for an extension of time to file a second amended petition, was granted until November 12, 1993, in #AS 92-13, Alumax, Inc., by a vote of 6-0. (BF)

A Order requesting the joint Petitioner's to review the amendments adopted in Docket R93-9 this date, and to advise the Board as to what affect the amendments have on the pleadings in the matter as they currently stand, and advising the parties that the Board intends to proceed ruling on the adjusted standard petition upon receipt of the information requested, was adopted in #AS 92-14, Joint Petition of Quantum Chemical, Corporation, USI Division and the Environmental Protection Agency, by a vote of 6-0. (RCF)

Petitioner's motion for an extension of time to file its response to the Agency's response to its amended petition, was granted until July 15, 1994, in #86-4, City of Morris, by a vote of 6-0. (RCF)

By a vote of 5-1, Complainants' motion for reconsideration was granted, and upon reconsideration, the Board modified its June 17, 1993 Board Order to include a specified timeframe for completion of the Respondents' remedial action, Respondents' motion for reconsideration was denied, and Complainants' motion for leave to file a response instanter was granted in #90-182, Ronald & Susan Tex. R.C. Flemal dissented. (GTG)

An Order directing the Petitioner to continue filing status reports every six months or sooner if the circumstances warrants, and directing the parties to file its next status report with the Board on or before February 1, 1994, was adopted in #91-75, Community Consolidated School District No. 15, by a vote of 6-0. (BF)

An Order accepting the joint status report, granting the parties's request to continue, and directing the parties to file with the Board, by September 16, 1993, its decision regarding a settlement one way or the other, was adopted in #91-157, The Grigoleit Company, by a vote of 6-0. (JA)

Petitioner's motion to withdraw was granted in ##91-158, -179, Commonwealth Edison, by a vote of 6-0. (GTG)

An Order granting the Petitioner's motion for reconsideration of the Board's July 1, 1993 Order, accepting the Petitioner's waiver of the decision deadline until December 31, 1994, and directing the parties to file an additional status report with the Board on or before January 24, 1994, was adopted in #91-162, Minnesota Mining & Manufacturing Company, by a vote of 6-0. (BF)

An Order granting the Petitioner's request for an expedited decision consistent with time constraints, and allowing briefs to be filed according to the schedule outlined in the Order, was adopted in #91-173, Marathon Oil Company, by a vote of 6-0. (RCF)

An Order granting the Petitioner's motion to withdraw was adopted in ##91-178, -180, Commonwealth Edison Company, by a vote of 6-0. (GTG)

An Order granting the Petitioner's motion to dismiss was adopted in #91-199, Commonwealth Edison Company, by a vote of 6-0. (RCF)

By a vote of 6-0, the Board granted the Agency's motion to file its status report instanter, and on its own motion, reconsidered its August 5, 1993 Board Order to correct erroneous language contained in the Order in #92-23, The Grigoleit Company. (JA)

An Order granting the Petitioner's motion to voluntarily dismiss the appeal, was adopted in #92-29, Safety-Kleen Corporation, by a vote of 6-0. (CAM)

An Order finding that Respondent's counter-claim is neither duplicitous or frivolous, was adopted in #92-33, Erich J. Mandel, by a vote of 6-0. (MN)

Agency motion for an extension of time to file the record was granted until December 21, 1993, and the parties were directed to file status reports by November 19, 1993, in #92-112, James River Paper Company, by a vote of 6-0. (BF)

Petitioner's motion to dismiss was granted in #92-117, IEI Barge, by a vote of 6-0. (RCF)

Petitioner's motion to dismiss was granted in #92-140, Motor Wheel Corporation, by a vote of 6-0. (BF)

By a vote of 6-0, the Board granted the Respondents' motions for leave to file instanter and for reconsideration of the Board's April 8, 1993 Board Order, and upon reconsideration, reaffirmed that part of the April 8, 1993 Order which finds the Respondents' in violation of the Act and the Board Regulations, reserved ruling on the balance of the Order relating to the civil penalty, found

that Complainant's motion for summary judgment was timely filed, found no absolute right to hearing in enforcement cases as suggested by the Respondents and found no reason to modify its April 8, 1993 Order, directed the Respondents to submit to Complainants', on or before October 15, 1993, a proper compliance plan, including a timetable and costs estimates, on or before December 6, 1993, the parties shall submit to the Board a proposal for settlement of the penalty issues, a status report, or any other appropriate pleading suggesting the appropriate means for final disposition of the proceedings in #92-164, Berniece & Darwin Kershaw. (GTG)

Petitioner's motion for reconsideration of the Board's July 22, 1993 Order, was denied in #92-200, Ron's Interstate Sunoco, by a vote of 6-0. (RCF)

An Order directing the parties to file a status report to be received by the Board on or before November 26, 1993, was adopted in #92-205, Douglas Furniture of California, by a vote of 6-0. (MN)

An Order directing the parties to file a status report with the Board on or before November 29, 1993, was adopted in #92-209, A.B. Dick Company, by a vote of 5-0. B. Forcade abstained. (GTG)

An Order directing the parties to submit status reports, to be received by the Board and the Hearing Officer no later than September 16, 1993, was adopted in #93-45, -46, St. Louis Auto Shredding, by a vote of 5-0. B. Forcade abstained. (RCF)

An Order denying Respondents' motion for leave to file its response to the Complainant's motion for summary judgment instanter, accepting Respondent's filing of its response to Complainant's request to admit, denying Complainant's motions to strike Respondent's response and for summary judgment, was adopted in #93-58, L. Keller Oil Properties, by a vote of 6-0. (MN)

An Order extending the stay of ruling on the Agency's motion for summary judgment until December 13, 1993, in order to give the Hearing Officer time to schedule a hearing in the event the motion for summary judgment is denied, and directing the parties to file a status report addressing the statute of notification of the decision of the State Fire Marshal, was adopted in #93-70, Joliet Park District, by a vote of 6-0. (JA)

Agency motion for an extension of time to file the Agency recommendation was granted until September 17, 1993, in #93-72, Atlanta Meadows Limited and R.O.C. Properties, Inc., General Partnership, by a vote of 6-0. (BF)

Agency motion to file the record instanter was granted in #93-80 Indian Prairie Community School District No. 204, by a vote of 6-0. (MN)

An Order denying the Petitioner's joint motion for rehearing and affirming its June 17, 1993 Board Order, was adopted in #93-101, Citizens Utilities Company of Illinois and Village of Plainfield, by a vote of 6-0. (GTG)

An Order denying the Petitioner's motion for summary judgment and the Agency's cross-motion for summary judgment, was adopted in #93-105, Divane Brothers Electric Company, by a vote of 6-0. (RCF)

An Order granting the Respondent's motion to postpone the Board's consideration of the stipulation and proposal for settlement for 60 days, or until October 25, 1993, and advising the parties that the Board anticipates that any additional filings in the matter will be received by the Board prior to October 25, 1993, was adopted in #93-118, Marsco Manufacturing Company, by a vote of 6-0. (BF)

Agency motion to file the record instanter was granted in #93-128, National Coatings, by a vote of 6-0. (GTG)

Agency motion to file its answer instanter was granted in #93-129, PPG Industries, by a vote of 6-0. (RCF)
