MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING JUNE 3, 1993 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

Chairman Manning called the meeting to order and announced the departure of Lou Ann Burnett, who has accepted a position as the Head of the Biological Safety Section of the Division of Environmental Health and Safety, at the University of Illinois in Urbana. Chairman Manning wished Ms. Burnett well, and also announced that Board Member M. Nardulli, is ill. All Board Members were present.

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #83-150, EPA v. Archer Daniels Midland Company, by a vote of 6-0. (CAM)

An Order was adopted in #AC 92-41(B), Lakewood Homes & Development Company, by a vote of 5-1. J. Theodore Meyer dissented. (BF)

Board Member J. Anderson presented a draft Opinion and Order in #92-152, State Bank of Whittington. Motion to amend by B. Forcade, and seconded by R.C. Flemal, failed to carry by a vote of 2-4 with B. Forcade and R.C. Flemal for it, and J. Anderson, G. Tanner Girard, C. Manning, and J. Theodore Meyer against it. The Opinion and Order was then adopted by a vote of 6-0. J. Theodore Meyer concurred. (JA)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #92-154, Shell Oil Company, by a vote of 6-0. (GTG)

A Resolution and Order was adopted in #RES 93-1 (R91-20), Potentially Infectious Medical Waste, by a vote of 6-0. (RCF)

In R93-2, Pretreatment Update, USEPA Regulations (July 1, 1992 through December 31, 1992), a Proposal for Public Comment, Proposed Opinion and Order, was adopted by a vote of 6-0. (JA)

Default Orders were adopted in these Administrative Citations by a vote of 6-0: ##93-14, H/L Disposal and Roy Larson; 93-15, CDT Landfill.

By a vote of 6-0, Complainant's motion for reconsideration was granted, and upon reconsideration, the Board vacated its February 4, 1993 Order, and entered a new Order requiring payment of \$90.00, representing the hearing costs incurred by Sangamon County, to be made to Sangamon County and the payment of \$862.25 to the General Revenue Fund representing hearing costs incurred by the Board, and denied Respondent's motion for stay as moot, in #AC 92-37(B), Gerald B. Miller. J. Anderson concurred. (BF)

An Order finding that the hearing costs incurred by the Board and Sangamon County were not excessive as alleged by the Respondent, was adopted in #AC 92-78(B), Philip Pennington, by a vote of 6-0. J. Anderson concurred. (RCF)

Complainant's motion to vacate an April 22, 1993 Board Order was granted and the docket was reopened in #AC 93-7, William G. Buckles, Jr., by a vote of 6-0. (CAM)

An Order directing the Agency to file its reply to Petitioner's amended petition before July 1, 1993, or to justify its continued delay, was adopted in #86-4, City of Morris, by a vote of 6-0. (RCF)

An Order directing the parties to file another status report on or before September 3, 1993 in the event that the case has not been dismissed, was adopted in #89-30, Olin Corporation, by a vote of 6-0. (CAM)

An Order directing the parties to provide written status reports to be received by the Board no later than September 15, 1993, was adopted in #91-84, Indian Refining Limited Partnership, by a vote of 5-0. B. Forcade abstained. (RCF)

An Order accepting the status report, and directing that another status report be filed by September 1, 1993, was adopted in #91-206, Clayton Chemical Company, by a vote of 6-0. (JTM)

By a vote of 6-0, an Order directing the parties to file a status report in accordance with the Hearing Officer Order, on or before September 15, 1993, and advising the parties that if any additional status reports are needed they shall be ordered by the Hearing Officer, was adopted in #91-208, Ashland Chemical. (CAM)

By a vote of 6-0, the Board, on its own motion, directed the Agency to file the Agency Record by June 14, 1993 in #91-219, General Motors Corporation. (JTM)

An Order directing the parties to file another status report with the Board on or before July 6, 1993, was adopted in #92-61, Ethyl Petroleum Additives, by a vote of 6-0. (JA)

An Order accepting the status report, and directing that the parties file an additional status report, or take further action on the case by August 3, 1993, was adopted in #92-69, Patterson Gear & Machine, by a vote of 6-0. (JA)

An Order directing the Petitioner to file an additional status report with the Board on or before October 1, 1993, was adopted in #92-108, The OK Trucking Company, by a vote of 6-0. (BF)

Petitioner's motion for voluntary dismissal was granted in #92-136, Safety-Kleen Corporation (Schaumburg Facility), by a vote of 6-0. (CAM)

An Order directing the parties to submit, on or before August 20, 1993, the appropriate filings with the Board, if it is determined that the issues can be resolved without further Board action, was adopted in #92-163, DJM Oil Company, by a vote of 6-0. (BF)

An Order granting the Agency's motion to file its status report instanter, and directing the Agency to file its next status report on or before August 9, 1993, was adopted in #92-205, Douglas Furniture, by a vote of 5-0. B. Forcade abstained. (JA)

Petitioner's motion for reconsideration of an April 8, 1993 Board Order was granted, and upon reconsideration, the Board issued a new Order, incorporating the changes requested by the Petitioner in #92-217, General Chemical Corporation, by a vote of 6-0. (BF)

Complainant's motion to dismiss the complaint was granted in #93-43, Leonard F. Wolst, by a vote of 6-0. (GTG)

By a vote of 6-0, the Board, on its own motion, directed the Clerk of the Board to continue to hold the material marked "confidential" in her confidential files until further notice, in ##93-60, -61, Industrial Salvage. (RCF)

An Order granting the parties' joint motion to stay the filing of Petitioner's response to the Agency's motion for summary judgment until July 21, 1993, and authorizing the Hearing Officer to cancel the June 9, 1993 hearing, was adopted in #93-70, Joliet Park District, by a vote of 6-0. (JA)

Agency motion to file the Record Instanter was granted in #93-71, Indian Refining Company, by a vote of 5-0. B. Forcade abstained. (GTG)

Agency motion to supplement the Administrative Record was granted in #93-73, J & M, Inc., by a vote of 6-0. (CAM)

Agency motion to file the Record Instanter was granted in #93-74, M.S. Carver Lumber Company, by a vote of 6-0. (CAM)

Agency motion to file the Record Instanter was granted in #93-79, Pace Suburban Bus Division of RTA, by a vote of 5-0. B. Forcade abstained. (GTG)

Agency motion to file the Record Instanter was granted in #93-84, Consolidation Coal Company, by a vote of 6-0. (BF)
