MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING February 19, 1981 Chicago, Illinois

All Board Members were present.

Opinions and Orders were adopted in these cases by a vote of 5-0: ##79-35, Chevy Chase; 79-110, Crest Hill (Interim Order); 79-122, Caseyville; 79-201, Apple River; 80-38, Bacon's Farm; 80-87, Missouri Pacific R.R.; 80-89-90, CILCO; 80-164; Politser; 80-223, Assumption; 80-226, Bensenville.

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #79-184, Roodhouse, by a vote of 4-1. Mr. Dumelle dissented.

An Opinion and Order was adopted in \$80-31, Burns v. Western Springs by a vote of 4-0. Mrs. Anderson abstained.

A Final Opinion was adopted in R71-24, R75-14, Beverage Container Regulations, by a vote of 5-0. Mr. Werner concurred.

Proposed Rules, First Notice were adopted in R76-21, Effluent Standards, by a vote of 5-0.

Motion to vacate was granted in #78-139, Vickery Manor, by a vote of 5-0. Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.

Motion to appear in #79-166, Shell Oil, was granted by a vote of 5-0. Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.

Motion to continue in #79-207, Romeoville, was granted by a vote of 5-0. Mr. Goodman will prepare an Order.

Motion to reconsider in #79-254, Cantrell v. Gaines, was denied by a vote of 5-0. Dr. Satchell will prepare an Order.

Motion to dismiss in #79-258, Continental Grain, was granted by a vote of 4-1. Mrs. Anderson dissented. Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.

Motion to reconsider was denied in #80-63, -64, Amax Coal, by a vote of 4-1. Mr. Goodman dissented. Dr. Satchell will prepare an Order.

Motion to intervene and petition for intervention were granted in #80-153, Hamman. A hearing was authorized. The vote was 5-0. Dr. Satchell will prepare an Order.

Motion to withdraw was granted in #80-210, Outboard Marine, by a vote of 5-0. Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.

An objection was withdrawn in #80-218, Mercy Hospital et al. The Board determined that since notice had been given the hearing should go on as scheduled. The Clerk was ordered to convey this to the Hearing Officer.

Motion to join other parties was granted in #80-230, Crook Development, by a vote of 5-0. An amendment was also requested. Mrs. Anderson will prepare an Order.

It was determined that no action was needed on a motion to dismiss in #81-9, Continental Grain, since the motion had been withdrawn.

An order was adopted on a motion to overrule the Hearing Officer in R80-22, AQS Amendments, by a vote of 5-0. Mr. Goodman will prepare an Order.

Motion to continue the stay of proceedings was granted in #79-141, Outboard Marine. Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.

Amended petitions in these cases were ordered held for Agency recommendations: ##80-229, Arlington Heights; 81-6, Congregation et al.

These cases were dismissed pursuant to prior Board Orders which ordered that hearings be set: ##78-128, Interlake; 79-187, Will County v. Crestwick. The vote was 5-0. Mrs. Anderson will prepare the Orders.

These cases were dismissed and held to March 5 for further discussion or possible decision: ##77-339, Cary; 78-263, East Peoria; 78-313, Citizens Utilities; 79-41, Geiss; 80-196, Ill. Leonard Sapp and Associates, were held for consideration on March 5.

Hearings were authorized in #\$1-23, -24, Alburn, Inc., by a vote of 5-0. Mrs. Anderson will prepare an Order.

A member of the public asked for clarification of the action taken by the Board with regard to the motions listed on the agenda in #80-153, Hamman. Dr. Satchell and Mr. Goodman explained the Order that would be entered.

All matters not disposed of as listed were ordered placed on an agenda for possible consideration on March 5.
